Anyone who purchases one of the memberships listed below now through December 31 of this year will receive a <u>free</u> Flint brick. What is a Flint brick? It is a piece of Corvette History! The GM Assembly Plant where the 300 1953 Corvettes were made in Flint, Michigan was razed in 2003. Thanks to General Motors, the National Corvette Museum has obtained the bricks. The preserved bricks have been cleaned, and these historic pieces of the 1953 Corvette's heritage are now available for Corvette enthusiasts to own.

These unique bricks come with an engraved sequence numbered plate and certificate of authenticity. The certificate of authenticity is signed by National Corvette Museum Executive Director Wendell Strode and the Chairman of the Board. They normally sell for \$25 each.

Just in time for Christmas shopping a new Corvette store site has been launched. The site offers many advantages over the old site, for example: 1. It is mobile device friendly and will adjust its layout to suit the phone or other device you use. 2. lt is linked your actual memberto ship records and will automatically determembership level and discount. mine your 3. Much-improved search, sharing and wish list features. 4. Order tracking and history.

Additional features will be rolled out on the new site over the next few months. We believe that you will be very impressed with the site on launch day and continue to be impressed as the NCM makes more and more functionality available to you.

One of the first post-live feature rollouts will be common sign-on between the store website and the event registration website. When this is complete, you will use the same password between the online store and the event registration system and a password change for one will immediately take effect for the other.

Soon afterward there will be a roll out of a much-improved Raffle ticket purchase experience. Stay tuned!

Because this is a completely new system, the accounts and passwords used in the previous online Corvette Store site will not migrate. The new site will already have customer records for all members and most previous online customers, so you should be able to immediately connect to your new account by using the "Forgot Your Password?" link on the site login page.

The weekend events started at the Sulphur Springs Country Club with a meet and greet followed by an excellent dinner. Entertainment was provided by Diamond Jim Tyler, who amazed all with his magic tricks and made everyone laugh with his many jokes and stories. At the end of the night, the host club, Sulphur Springs Corvette Club, drew names for door prizes. Among the prizes were tools, passes for the Texas ½ Mile Shootout, and a 50"LGTV. On Saturday morning, Corvettes representing all generations made their way to Celebration Square for the show. LSCC was represented by 17 Corvettes. 
