The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just click on <u>Open Road Racing</u>.

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in the Dallas Autorama. On the first Saturday of each month, you'll find a bunch of us at Cars & Coffee in Plano, "kicking tires" and telling tall tales about our cars.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. Just "click" on "Event Calendar".

Two great events are coming up soon at the NCM, so I will give you information on those. Also, the 2018 Corvette model year has come to a close five months earlier than normal, so we have the production stats for you.

NCM Bash – April 26-28

Being the NCM's largest event, it is definitely worth the trip to Bowling Green. But what makes it even better is that it is the back half of a great tour starting at the Hot Springs, Arkansas Corvette Weekend. Mike Krieger has put this together and more information on the entire trip is in this newsletter.

Bash 2018 will provide enthusiasts the chance to see the new 2019 Corvette Stingray and ZR1 up close as well as the getting all the latest information on the all new ZR1 Corvette.

As in past years there will be a large contingent of GM engineers and designers from Warren Tech Center, and the Bowling Green Assembly Plant ready to answer your every question. Back this year will be our Corvette Racing team with Doug Fehan, Paul Pearson with his 7th gen infotainment / navigation seminar as well as a presentation on our restored 1962 Sinkhole Corvette. Also back to Bash is our LT4 Engine building demonstration by BGAP Brian Lee and John Wurth.

Returning activities include a seminar and classroom sessions by GM certified Corvette Technician Paul Koerner. Enjoy guided road tours, two celebrity choice car shows, the Ladies' Oasis, and the expanded Garage Party with women of the GM Corvette Team. The ladies will cover all aspects of Corvettes including maintenance, engineering and even high- performance driving (ladies only).

2018 Corvette Production Stats

2018 model year production began June 5, 2017 and ended January 28, 2018. During that time the plant was down for three months to upgrade the assembly line. So, 2018 production was for only five months, <u>yielding</u> 9,686 Corvettes.

I believe this may be the shortest production year in Corvette history. 1953 production was the shortest at about 6 months.

The 9,686 production number is well below the 2017 number of 32,782. The 2017 model was only produced for 10 months. Not surprisingly the 2018 total is the lowest model year production since 1959, when 9,670 Corvettes were built, all convertibles.

Looking at the final numbers for 2018 there are some interesting numbers – for example, Stingray, Grand Sport and Z06 were surprisingly close in totals produced. That and some other interesting facts:

	39.3% Stingrays; 31.8% Grand Sport; 28.9% Z06
	17.5% of Corvettes built were convertibles
	Automatic transmissions outsold manuals once again at 78%.
	The 1LT package was most popular for Stingray Coupes, while the 2LT was the top pick for Stingray Convertibles and Grand Sports. The 3LZ was again the most popular for Z06 models.
	Almost 30% of Z06s opted for the Z07 performance package.
	Arctic White once again topped the list as most popular color, and for the first time in several years – when you add the two 'reds' together, they don't beat out white (just barely though)!

There are 22 interior options, so I will not list them all, but some form of black led the way with 6,393, followed by Adrenaline Red 1,906, Gray 700, Kalamari 606 and Spice Red 81.



- All floats and drivers must be ready to begin the parade one (1) hour before
 the parade starts. If there is a delay, we must know in advance. Please
 contact the Mardi Gras Chairman Tyler Thomas 940-284-9647 or the
 chamber office at 940-825-3526.
- Driver must remain in the cab of the float. Drivers ARE NOT allowed to consume alcoholic beverages before or during the parade and we reserve the right to test drivers to determine if they are fit to drive.
- All drivers must be at least 18 years of age and be in possession of a valid driver's license.
- 4. All floats are to be decorated in the theme of your choice. All participants must be costumed and must throw beads, candy, etc.
- 5. It is required to have at least one fire extinguisher on board every float if you have a generator on board. Generators must be properly ventilated and extension cords should be carefully placed.
- 6. Once the parade has started, it is not to stop unless in a case of extreme emergency. Also, once the parade has started all float riders are to remain on the float and not get off and on.
- Glass containers of any type are not allowed on floats.
- All riders should be on their floats and in place one hour prior to parade time.
- No trash is to be thrown on the streets or in the formation area. Please try to keep your area picked up and clean.
- 10. Avoid throwing beads, etc. directly in front and back of the floats. Aim at the back of the crowd.
- 11.Nocona chamber of Commerce nor the City of Nocona does not accept any responsibility for any accidents or damage to any floats or riders in the parade. All entries and participants do so at their own risk.
- 12. There is no entry fee to participate in the parade.
- Please only throw beads, etc. in downtown area where barricades are present, not on entire route of parade.







Requests for assistance will be reviewed prior to the 1st month of each calendar quarter, and the approved requests will be announced at the 1st Club Meeting of each quarter. At that meeting, plans for providing assistance to the approved organization will be presented to the Membership.

2018 Rotating Charity Nominations

Top O' Hill Terrace Historic Site Nominated by Clark Kirby



SIGNIFICANCE

Top O' Hill Terrace, in Arlington, was founded in 1921 as a restaurant with a tea garden that had a scenic view of Fort Worth to the West. In 1927, at the height of Prohibition, Fred Browning, bought the restaurant and its 35 acres of land. Shortly thereafter, the Top O' Hill Terrace was converted into a "speakeasy": an illegal casino, bordello and nightclub. It soon became a popular destination for the rich, the notorious, the famous and the infamous. It is now known as the "Vegas" before Las Vegas because of its comprehensive offerings of sin and its perks for gamblers.

From day one, Top O' Hill Terrace became the favorite target of firebrand Fort Worth preacher Rev. J. Frank Norris, the pastor of Ft. Worth's First Baptist Church. The Reverend, who was nationally known due to his radio ministry, built his reputation as a crusader against alcohol, prostitution and gambling. For decades, the casino used manned gates and alarms to warn of a raid. Alarms rang while the gatekeeper stalled the law and gambling equipment was stashed behind trap doors in the walls. Those wanted by the law would disappear, with their gambling winnings, through underground tunnels dug for such a purpose. In 1947, one final raid by four Texas Rangers, was successful at Top O' Hill Terrace.

It is believed that Top O' Hill Terrace is unique due to the fact that the site is the country's only casino-turned-seminary. Its unusual story deserves to be kept alive as part of local history. With the loss of the "Skyliner Ballroom" in Fort Worth (demolished 1969) and Galveston's "Balinese Room" pier having been washed away by a hurricane (2008), Top O' Hill Terrace is the only survivor of this type of illegal establishment in Texas.

ENDANGERMENT

The place is aptly named as it sits on top of a hill. The Western portion of the property is a high bluff, overlooking the Trinity River Valley to the North and the City of Fort Worth to the West. Some years ago, due to erosion on the bluff, one of the major retaining walls supporting the Tea Garden collapsed. As a result, one of the corners of the Tea Garden, where Sally Rand and Her Famous Fans once performed, is in imminent danger of sliding down the hill, to be lost forever.

Pregnancy Help 4 U is a (501c3) Medical Clinic in Keller

We offer free pregnancy tests, free sonograms and STD testing plus treatment and are providing an abstinence program.

Our counselors help women and men choose the life affirming options of adoption and parenting. We provide resources that help our clients succeed in life and succeed as a parent. There is no judgement here and we treat all clients with respect.

These services are not all we offer – our clients find hope and the love of Christ with compassionate care.

Our clients are as young as 13 years old and range up to 50 years old, in unplanned pregnancy situations with a need for support. We provide options on Parenting, Adoption and Abortion. We also offer a Post Abortion Recovery Class that 63 women have experienced. Male counseling is offered by male counselors and we include men in all our programs.

PH4U walks with girls through their pregnancy. We are funded by individuals, grants and local churches.

We truly see lives changed here at PH4U. In 2016 we had 566 abortion vulnerable women choose life. We performed 792 pregnancy tests and 924 sonograms with 14,652 material assistance items given out to clients.

The best part of this work is holding the babies when they come back for a visit. There is no time that we stop walking through life with our clients, we encourage and provide diapers, wipes, and baby items when they need us.

Heroes on the Water

Heroes on the Water helps our Nation's warriors and veterans from all branches of the United States military unwind using the therapeutic qualities of fishing from kayaks. What looks like a day trip of paddling and fishing is in fact something much deeper and long-lasting.

Founded in 2007, our unique kayak fishing program allows the participants a chance to decompress from the stresses associated with combat and the physical rigors of rehabilitation. Warriors enjoy these benefits while on guided fishing trips held in local communities around the country.

Participants receive basic kayak fishing and paddling instruction, angling clinics and paddling classes for participants with skill sets ranging from beginners to the most experienced paddlers. The program also assists these personnel in adapting these newly developed skills to their new abilities. Adaptive kayaks, kayaking accessories and angling equipment is offered on an as needed basis to accommodate a soldier's particular needs.

Our program is unique in that it is a long-term activity, not a one-time event. We believe that the effectiveness of the program is a direct result of engaging the wounded military personnel for the long-term

One soldier, at the Center for the Intrepid, called what we do "Triple Therapy" or "all at once therapy." On post he has to go to the gym for physical therapy, then go upstairs for his occupational therapy, and then go to the psychologist for mental therapy. With kayak fishing he gets it all at once – physical therapy from paddling and fishing, occupational therapy learning a lifetime sport/activity, and mental therapy from relaxing in nature with no distractions or expectations of performance.
