#### NCM News

The 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration is our news source this month. At least one newsworthy item occurred every day of the event.

#### Sinkhole

The biggest news concerns the sinkhole, so many of you already know this story. The NCM Board of Directors met on Saturday, August 30<sup>th</sup>. After careful review of additional information and revised plans with price quotes from the construction company, we voted to fill in the sinkhole.

While the consensus had been to keep a portion of the hole open, it was determined that additional safety features would be required along with humidity control. The price tag to leave the hole open rose to \$1 million more than to just cover the hole. In addition, safety features, including retaining walls, beams, and micro pilings, would be visible, eliminating the natural look of the sinkhole.

The Museum plans a meaningful exhibit within the Skydome, featuring the cars involved, 3D interactive images of the sinkhole, videos, photos, and more.

Speaking of cars, it was confirmed that Chevrolet will restore the "Blue Devil" 2009 ZR1 prototype and the 1-millionth Corvette produced, a white 1992 convertible. The GM Heritage Center will oversee this process. In fact, these two cars were picked up on Sunday, August 31, the day after the end of the 20<sup>th</sup> Celebration.

Chevrolet will fund the restoration of the 1962, but the NCM will choose the restorer with aid from the NCRS. The remaining five cars will be preserved in their current state and made a part of the permanent sinkhole display.

#### **Motorsports Park Sponsors**

Two great sponsorships were announced during the 20<sup>th</sup> Celebration.

First, the Mobil One racing division of Exxon Mobil became an official partner and the official oil of the NCM Motorsports Park.

Then, a partnership was announced naming Ron Fellows Performance Driving School at Spring Mountain, Nevada as the "Official Performance Driving School of the National Corvette Museum" and "Official Partner of the NCM Motorsports Park."

Tentative plans are for the schools to begin in the second quarter of 2015.

#### Awards, Gifts and Recognition

LSCC and its members were involved in some sort of rec-

ognition every day we were at the Museum.

On Wednesday, immediately following our arrival, some of our members participated in a brick ceremony. Stephanie Morrill, NCM Membership Services Director, unveiled the new bricks of 17 LSCC members. They were placed below the plaque recognizing LSCC as a major contributor to the 2008 Museum expansion.

Thursday started early for twelve LSCC members as they assembled at the NCM Motorsports Park. There they participated in the inaugural laps around the new track representing LSCC as a 3-acre contributor to the MSP. The laps did not go quite as planned. If you want the rest of the story, talk to the Herricks, Elmores, Horas, Bechtols, Slocombs, or Shellbergs.

Also participating in the inaugural laps as individual acre owners were Linda Ullom, Mike and Pam Dale, and Johnny and Edie Downs. They can tell the rest of the story, too.

Friday was another early start for one LSCC member, me. The Ambassadors' Breakfast and Awards Ceremony kicked off at 7:00 am. It was worth it as out of several hundred newsletters across the country, our *LSCC Newsletter* was chosen third best! I was happy to accept the award for **Gaila Hodges (and GH?)** which we presented to them that evening. Congratulations for a well deserved honor.

Also at the Ambassadors' Breakfast, Master Ambassador certificates were presented. This recognizes ambassadors whose clubs and club members provide a very high degree of support to the NCM. Thanks to members of LSCC, *Edie* and *I received Master Ambassador status for the tenth year in a row*. This is every year since the program was initiated.

Saturday, the last day, was one of numerous presentations, the first being Andy Pilgrim.

## LSCC Needs YOU Club Officer Nominations Open This Month

It's that time of the year again when the Club membership will nominate officers for the next year. **ALL officer positions are open for nominations**. The officers in *RED* will be either open positions or are held by officers who will have completed the maximum two years of service in their respective positions.

The term of office for Officers will be not more than two full, consecutive terms. Partial terms are not counted as part of a full term.

Officers will be nominated in October and November, voted on in December, and installed into office in January (except for the Classic Officer-elect as noted in bylaws), and will serve for one calendar year. To be nominated for a position on the Board of Directors, either elected or appointed, the candidate must be a full member for twelve months prior to the nomination month.

Nominations for officers will be made from the floor by the membership at the October and November business meetings, or in writing to an officer prior to the November business meeting.

The following is a brief sum<mark>mary o</mark>f Officer positions. Complete details can be vie<mark>wed in</mark> the <u>Bylaws</u> on the Club website:

**President**: Preside over business and Board of Director meetings, and serve as Chairman of the Board of Directors. Appoint committees, as necessary, to meet the needs of the club. Maintain and develop relationships with: Club Sponsor, General Motors, National Corvette Museum and other clubs. Provide planning strategies that support LSCC's welfare and future success.

**Vice President**: Preside at the Board of Director and business meeting in the absence of the President. Arrange and schedule monthly business and Board of Directors meetings. Assist the President, when required. Coordinate charitable activities. Maintain, update and coordinate Board of Director job descriptions. Maintain storage of LSCC documents and records.

**Competitive Events Officer**: Organize car shows – in town and out of town. Organize participation in racing activities – drag racing, auto cross and rallies. Coordinate participation in NCRS activities. Distribute cruise night activity information.

Recreational Events Officer: Coordinate car displays. Coordinate road trips.

**Recording Secretary**: Keep the minutes of the business and Board of Directors meetings and will submit same to the Board of Directors and the business meeting minutes to the newsletter editor. Maintain all written communications for the club. Maintain the club Bylaws.

**Membership Officer**: Process and maintain all applications for membership and membership records. Publish the annual printed membership directory.

**Financial Officer**: Maintain an accurate accounting of all financial transactions. Provide monthly financial statements. Develop an annual budget.

**Treasurer**: Responsible for all payments and deposits of funds. Supervise the purchasing and sale of merchandise. Supervise all raffles. Maintain physical asset inventory and control.

**Newsletter Editor**: Produce the Club's monthly newsletter. You are the editor, so the Newsletter can take on whatever design you feel reflects the Club. Members are very good about submitting material, so your primary function is editing, design, and formating. The current editorial staff has demonstrated that someone with nearly zero experience in desktop publishing can do this job. The current staff will assist you to ensure a smooth transition.

**Classic Officer**: Manage the Classic administration and logistical support. Oversee the operation of the event itself.

Technical Officer: Maintain the website. Maintain records that measure event effectiveness.

If you enjoy an activity of the Lone Star Corvette Club, it's probably because someone like you volunteered to make it happen.

#### News from the Corvette Plant by Johnny Downs

During the 20th Anniversary Celebration the following information was shared by Harlan Charles, Corvette Marketing Manager, and Jeff LaMarche, Corvette Plant Manager.

- ✓ 37,288 2014 Corvettes were produced. This is the most since 2007.
- ✓ 29 MPG and 0-60 in 3.7 seconds are early results of standard C7 with new 8 speed automatic transmission (faster than 7 speed manual).
- ✓ Z06 ordering was scheduled to start about September 15th.
- Z06 shipping is expected to start in November-December.
- Z06 convertibles are projected to begin assembly in early 2015 or sooner.
- ✓ Z06 engines initially will be produced in Tonawanda, New York, exceptions being Z07 option and build-your-own, which will be produced in Bowling Green.
- ✓ Z06 *build-your-own* engine is starting January 2015, and VIP lounge is under construction.
- ✓ 171 cars per day is the current build schedule.
- ✓ Z06's for test fleet started assembly in late August.
- ✓ Z06 convertibles are projected to begin assembly in early 2015 or sooner.
- ✓ 1,300 Corvette enthusiasts per day toured the plant during the 20th Anniversary Celebration.

This group was led by Curt Troster. Others escaped the outside heat with tours of Mammoth Cave National Park, 200 feet below the ground and 54 degrees cool. That evening the Museum held another top shelf dinner and program, inducting three new members into the Corvette

Hall of Fame. Video presentations acquainted us with the inductees' impact on the Corvette world. LSCC was very well represented yet again by 100 folks. And, we got to see our own Johnny Downs wearing his NCM Board Chairman hat! Afterward, Johnny presented a Third Place Newsletter award from the Museum to the Hodges during yet another Lobby Lizard party.


