As you have read or heard, a two day stop at the Museum and NCM Motorsports Park is the first leg of possibly the best and most unique trip we have done. The trip has three distinct parts and you can do one, two or all three. As an example, if you cannot take more than a few days away, go with us on Saturday to Nashville and then the NCM and be home on Wednesday.

Our members that are into high-performance driving will probably spend both days at the Motorsports Park. For the rest of the folks, Corvette plant tours and Museum tours are some exciting opportunities available through the Museum. Because of limited availability, now is the time to make reservations if you are interested.

NCM Xperience

The best way to describe this is a Museum Delivery without having to buy the car. Owners schedule a visit to the Museum, where their car is given a thorough cleaning. While the car is detailed, the owners are given a VIP tour (see below) of the Corvette plant and a Museum tour. Upon completion, they will find their Corvette displayed in the delivery area alongside new cars ready for Museum Delivery.

Xperience participants receive a commemorative plaque, a silver decal recognizing participation in the program and an individual photograph in front of the Museum. Participants also have the opportunity to purchase special merchandise showcasing the NCM Xperience logo.

The cost of the Xperience is \$500.00. Museum Delivery lists for \$990.00. Edie and I have done the Xperience and it is well worth the cost.

VIP Tour

How would you like to see the Corvette assembly plant on your own private tour? The NCM can make it happen. VIP tours last 3-4 hours and include the assembly plant and the Museum.

You are taken by your guide from the Museum to the plant. The tour follows the same route as the public tour, but at your pace with much more information imparted from the very knowledgeable NCM guide. Many of the guides are retired plant employees.

After the plant tour you will be transported back to the Museum. Your guided tour of the Museum will include behind the scenes looks at the Museum Delivery prep area and the hidden storage area filled with cars not on display.

The VIP tour price is \$200.00. The group size can be up to four people. Additional people can be added for \$50.00 each to a maximum of seven.

Once again it's time to prep your cars and get mentally prepared for the LSCC autocross season. The LSCC autocross will be held on the third Saturday of each month beginning in March and ending in November. The exception will be May where we will run the Saturday after the LSCC Classic.

The first race of the season will be on March 21st. We will be holding our events at Brookhaven College. Brookhaven

is located at 3939 Valley View Lane (Valley View Lane and Alpha Road) in Farmers Branch. We will be racing on parking lot P2. P2 has about the same useable area as the lot we raced on last year and is concrete rather than asphalt. See this link of the Brookhaven <u>campus map</u>.

Setup will begin at 8:30 am. For those who want to help set up, please try to be there at 8:30 am. The more help we have the quicker we get to start. Drivers not helping with setup should be there no later than 9:00 am to register and sign waivers. We should begin racing at 9:30 am.

Please remember the fee to drive is \$15 per car. All drivers and passengers must be members of LSCC. Drivers and passengers must wear a helmet when on the course. Non-members who attend the event must remain in a designated spectator area and may not enter the pits when anyone is on the course.

Dates for the autocross in 2015 are: March 21, April 18, May 23, June 20, July18 (if temperature permits), August 15 (if temperature permits), September 19, October 17 and November 21 (rain date).

I am excited about this year and look forward to seeing you there.

Annual Corvette Weekend in Hot Springs, Arkansas, April 16th-19th: Hosted by the Central Arkansas Corvette Club, this show is held indoors at the Hot Springs Convention Center. The weekend includes a Thursday night Happy Hour, Friday night BBQ, and Saturday Catfish, Chicken and Fried Pie Lunch. Other events include a poker run, silent auction, a 50/50 pot, a Corvette parade through downtown Hot Springs, a scenic road tour, and a Cannonball Run. Road Trips

Wow, is there ever a lot of info to share about the LSCC 2015 major trip. This trip will start June 20th and we will be back to DFW metroplex July 1st. There are so many cool places to visit; you could say there are five trips packed into one. We will experience Country Music, Corvettes, NASCAR, America's big house, motorcycle history, country roads. Most importantly, we will become better acquainted with other LSCC members. This trip is planned in such a way that you can go for the full

ticket or any part of it. Here are some sights we plan to take in:

Nashville, TN:

- **Gaylord Opryland** This hotel is a destination in itself. Opryland has 2,881 rooms and suites. More than 750 garden atrium rooms overlook the hotel's nine acres of indoor gardens. Everything from poolside snacks to fine dining is available for guests. Indoor and outdoor swimming pools and a health spa are hotel amenities, all adding to the impressiveness of the Opryland Hotel experience.
- Country Hall of Fame and Museum Music and history lovers can mix and mingle over the exhibits and peruse the plaques dedicated to country music's finest. There is the two-story wall plastered with every gold and platinum country record produced, and then you can head to Studio B. One of the world's most influential recording studios and a Music Row Landmark, Studio B produced more than 35,000 songs by legends like Dolly Parton, Waylon Jennings and Roy Orbison. For an interactive history lesson on the roots and evolution of country music, take a self-guided walk through the Sing Me Back Home: A Journey Through Country Music exhibit, which spans two floors of the museum
- **Ryman Auditorium** Known as the mother church of country music, this building has become a Nashville institution and part of many country music legends' careers.

Bowling Green, KY:

- NCM Motorsport Park LSCC has exclusive use of the new NCM racetrack facilities for two days which means we can set up our own schedule. As Mike Krieger shared in the LSCC Newsletter: "Think of this as a "Street Survival" course to improve your everyday driving skills. There will be some classroom time, along with seat time practicing collision avoidance, freeway speed maneuvers, lead and follow track time at a slower freeway speed (for the nonadrenaline junkies) and some open lap time for those who wish to exercise all the ponies under the right foot."
- **NCM Experience** LSCC will have the opportunity to participate in the "NCM Xperience" which can be arranged through Johnny Downs. See Corvette Museum articleWWW, in the LSCC Newsletter, for more information.
- Corvette Assembly Plant tour GM began production of the esteemed Corvette in Bowling Green in 1981, and the facility has remained the exclusive home of the Corvette. See Corvette Museum article, in the LSCC Newsletter, for more information.
- **NCM tour** Corvette enthusiasts from all over the world kindly and lovingly refer to the NCM as their home ... Their Mecca. A guided tour of the Museum will take us on a stroll through Corvette's history, its

racing heritage, and give you a glimpse at the Corvette lifestyle. See Corvette Museum article, in the LSCC Newslet- -ter, for more information.

• **Kentucky Country Tour** – There are several sidetrip options on your own: bourbon distillery, cheese factory, and cave tours.

Charlotte, NC:

- Rick Hendrick's car collection The Hendrick Heritage Center is a breathtaking 58,000 square foot museum dedicated to the heritage of Rick Hendrick and his passion for classic and high-performance cars. This museum is not open to the public, so being invited to see it is an honor. Stepping inside the door will take you back to when American muscle cars ruled the street and gas was only 31 cents a gallon. The Heritage Center currently houses more than 100 of the finest and rarest automobiles you will ever see in one place. It is hard to find pictures, but this <u>link</u> is for Brad Paisley's "Old Alabama" video, which was shot in the Heritage Center, local area and used cars from the collection.
- Hendrick Motorsports Since 1984, Hendrick Motorsports has earned a record 11 car owner championships in NASCAR's premier division, the Sprint Cup Series. The organization fields four full-time Chevrolet teams on the Sprint Cup circuit with drivers Kasey Kahne, Jeff Gordon, Jimmie Johnson and Dale Earnhardt Jr. Kasey Kahne (#5) enters his fourth year with Hendrick Motorsports and has 17 wins and 84 top 5 finishes. Jeff Gordon (#24) is a four-time NASCAR Series champion, a three-time Daytona 500 winner, a fivetime Brickyard 400 winner and is the third all-time most winning NASCAR driver. This will be Jeff's last year of racing, so if you are a fan, you will want see his garage area. Jimmy Johnson (#48) continues to chase history entering the 2015 NASCAR Sprint Cup season with six championship titles (he needs one more title to catch NASCAR Hall of Famers Dale Earnhardt Sr. and Richard Petty). Dale Earnhardt Jr is a third-generation driver in a family forever connected to the sport of stock-car racing; race fans have selected him a record 12 consecutive times as the winner of NASCAR's Most Popular Driver award.
- RCR Museum Richard Childress Racing is compiled of Richard's grandson, Austin Dillon #3, Paul Menard (#27) and Ryan Newman (#31) and is home of the Goodwrench Chevrolet that Dale Earnhardt Sr. piloted for 17 years and earned seven NASCAR championship titles.
- **Childress Vineyards** Childress Vineyards features 72 acres of vineyards. White varieties include Viognier, Chardonnay, Pinot Gris, Sauvignon Blanc and Riesling. The red varieties of Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, Malbec and Syrah. They have an outstanding restaurant and wine shop; so guess where we'll have lunch!

- Charlotte Motor Speedway The Over the Wall Tour is designed for the hard-core NASCAR fan. This intimate group tour includes all the details of the Feel the Thrill Tour. In addition to a detailed visit to the zMAX Dragway and The Dirt Track at Charlotte, we will have a walking tour through The Speedway Club and visit one of the 113 suites, Performance Racing Network (PRN) studios, and experience the breathtaking view of Charlotte Motor Speedway from the top of the Ford Grandstand. Later we will cruise down pit road and experience first-hand the feel of the 24 degree banking. We can tour the Media Center and take a walk down memory lane as we view timeless photos of CMS history.
- Billy Graham Library (optional) Famous evangelist Billy Graham started his ministry in 1949. His library is a public museum documenting his life and ministry and includes a dairy bar café', bookstore and lovely grounds.

Asheville, NC:

- Biltmore Estate Completed in 1895, George Vanderbilt's 250-room chateau is as impressive today as it was more than a century ago. Biltmore House is truly a wonder of architecture and hospitality. We plan to tour the house, as well as the beautiful gardens and grounds surrounding it, designed by renowned landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted.
- Downtown Asheville Shop historic downtown Asheville which is known for art deco, beaux arts and neoclassical styles. Artists and street musicians add to the boutique shopping experience.
- Lake Lure (Optional) The Lodge on Lake Lure is the only accommodation on the shores of picturesque Lake Lure. Chimney Rock Park is within 15 minutes of the Lodge. Flat Rock Playhouse, Downtown Hendersonville and the music scene of Asheville are close by. Waterfalls, State and National Parks and mountain hiking are within reach.

Maggie Valley - Visit The Wheels Through Time Museum, which is the home of the world's premier collection of rare American Vintage motorcycles. Almost all of the historic machines on display are kept in running and operating condition.

- **Moonshiner 28** It's fast becoming one of the great must-do roads of western North Carolina with very scenic sights, if you slow down enough.
- Tail of the Dragon Spirited drive taking in the well-known section of 318 curves in 11 miles. It's been deemed American's number one road for sports cars. The road is bordered by the Great Smoky Mountains and the Cherokee National Forest, with no intersecting roads or driveways to interrupt your drive.



A little background on the Auction: more than half a century ago, the Club came up with the idea to put on a car show, have lots of Corvette fun, and hold an auction to raise money for our beneficiaries. That idea has grown into the present-day Lone Star Corvette Classic, an annual 3-day Event held each May at Texas Motor Speedway. The Classic Auction now generates around \$30K, which is split 40% to Speedway Children's Charities, 40% to The National Corvette Museum, and 20% to our Rotating Charity. This year, that Rotating Charity is Defenders of Freedom.

Each of those organizations are 501(c)(3) designated. Speedway Children's Charities makes grants to community-based groups who provide services to kids and their families. Defenders of Freedom assists veterans as they transition from military to civilian life. The National Corvette Museum provides driver safety information and informative programs for kids, in addition to preserving the history of "America's Sports Car."

SO, WHAT CAN I DO, YOU ASK? Make something, buy something, ask the people you do business with for donations; all are great ways to come up with items to auction. At the February meeting, one of our members won a Chevy toolbox in the Raffle; he already had one, so he donated it to the Auction. Another very "crafty" member makes one-of-a-kind lamps from wine bottles, and donates those. Others ask the restaurant where they eat regularly for gift certificates. When you're at a yard sale, garage sale or craft fair, pick up inexpensive items that can be grouped into gift baskets. Framed Corvette posters bring in lots of \$\$\$; autographed items, and unusual car accessories, books and jewelry with Vette themes are very popular.
