Last month Edie and I made our fifth trip of the year to the National Corvette Museum. We were there for the December Board of Directors meeting, my last as Chairman. We were also lucky enough to arrange Museum delivery of our new Corvette following the last day of meetings. This saved us from making a sixth trip to Bowling Green.

Don't get me wrong, we love all our friends at the NCM and enjoy our time spent in Kentucky. Thanks to the sinkhole and its associated issues, we made six trips to the Museum in 2014. It's just that when we reach six trips, it is tempting to think about just moving to Bowling Green. But six grandchildren in Texas make moving impossible! So, saving a trip is good.

Following is news from the December board meeting and some highlights from our Museum delivery, but first some thoughts resulting from a conversation with Adam Boca about insurance.

### **Lesson Learned About Corvette Insurance**

During a discussion on NCM Insurance at the Board meeting, it was brought out that despite good success reaching NCM members, the great majority that only own late model Corvettes do not take advantage of the collector car insurance. Later, I spoke with Adam about this. Armed with information he gave me, I will try to explain how most LSCC members can save substantial dollars on Corvette insurance.

I will start by sharing my personal experience. For a number of years I had collector car insurance on our older cars. The company did not offer coverage for newer cars. When NCM Insurance opened for business in 2010, I got a quote. On our older cars the savings were worthwhile, but not huge. NCM also offered to cover our late model Corvettes. The savings were huge! On three cars, a '95, '07 and '08 we cut our premiums by over \$2,100.00.

We used some of the numerous options available on an NCM policy to save money and get unmatched coverage. They include:

**Mileage** – Annual mileage limits can save money. We chose varying limits on our cars from 1,000

to 6,000. Unlimited is also available, as is rollover miles.

Agreed Value – An agreed value is established on the policy, and if there is a total loss you are paid that amount. If you have added dress-up accessories and/or wheels to your Corvette, at the very least you will have some difficulty collecting for those in the event of a loss on a "regular" policy. With agreed value add the cost of those items to the book value of the car up front. You will recover your investment, no questions asked, if a loss occurs.

If you have a special edition, such as a Pace Car, you know most used car value guides do not list adds for these vehicles. Again, this can be a problem with a regular policy. We researched for sale prices of Ron Fellows Editions and Pace Cars then we set agreed value amounts on our cars that would easily cover the cost to replace them.

Most standard auto insurance is "actual cash value", which is the book value at time of loss, not an agreed amount. Some collector policies are "stated value", which is up to a stated amount, meaning it can be less than the agreed amount if the company decides to reduce it.

There are a couple of other things to consider. NCM members get a 10% discount. That discount alone will pay the membership dues in many cases. There is sometimes concern about losing the multi-car discount on the regular car policy by moving the Corvette to NCM. The savings on the Corvette policy is usually 3 or 4 times more than any multi-car discount.

Here are a few examples of NCM insurance premiums:

### 2014 Corvette

6,000 miles or less driven per year \$60K value \$725 per year

### 1999 Corvette

3,000 miles or less driven per year \$15K value \$325 per year

### 1965 Corvette

3,000 miles or less driven per year \$70K value \$366 per year

# **NCM Board Meeting**

One of the major actions taken in the December meeting was the election of the 2016 Corvette Hall of Fame inductees. One person is chosen in each of three categories:

Racing – Bob Bondurant – during Corvettes early years, he helped validate the 'Vette as a world class sports car, winning 30 of 32 races from 1959 to 1963.

GM/Chevrolet – Ralph Kramer – was one of the first Chevrolet executives to bolster GM support for the Corvette Museum in its founding years.

Enthusiast – Donna Mae Mimms – racer, writer, event organizer, and proponent of all things Corvette, "The Lady In Pink"

Also of Interest at the Board meeting was the report from Bowling Green Assembly. Current production, maintaining a pace of 40,000 cars for 2016 model year: 170 per day on a 10 hour per day, 5 day per week schedule. Thirty percent of those are Z06's. Two colors will be discontinued for 2017. They are Night Race Blue and Daytona Sunrise Orange. Selling at less than 1% of total, Night Race Blue may no longer be available by the time you read this.

Cheers and Happy New Year to all. Are you ready for the Club's 2016 big trip? While I am far from having all the details worked out, here is an outline I am working toward. For those who need to plan for vacation time, we are planning to leave Saturday, July 30<sup>th</sup>, and return on August 10th.

This year we will be heading north to Michigan and Wisconsin. A couple of years ago, Doug Fehan <a href="http://www.corvetteracing.com/team/dougfehan.shtml">http://www.corvetteracing.com/team/dougfehan.shtml</a>, Corvette Racing's Program Manager, suggested a cool trip for LSCC. The trip is centered round the Road America racetrack located in Elkhart Lake, WI. For those unfamiliar with Road America, Road America has hosted races since the 1950's and currently hosts the Weather Tech Sports-Car Championship Series, in which Corvette is a competitor. The Road America is one of only a handful of road circuits in the world maintaining its original configuration, being 4.048 miles in length with 14 turns. The track features many elevation changes, along with a long front stretch where speeds approach 200 mph. They will have a Corvette Corral so we'll be a special part of the event.

The Race may be the focal point of the trip, but before we get there, we'll plan to visit the GM Heritage Center and Pratt Miller facility near Detroit, drive up through Michigan passing through the scenic Traverse City area along the eastern side of Lake Michigan, up over the Mackinaw Bridge (of course stopping to see Mackinaw Island—on foot since no vehicles allowed) and then head south through Wisconsin, hoping to stop off at Lambeau Field for a tour and a boys camp run by the one of the Corvette Racing team members, to Elkhart Lake. Other en route stops may include Ford Museum, Indianapolis Raceway and Mid America. For those who are newer to the Club, road trips are the one of the best opportunities to meet members and make new friends.

As always, this will be a hop-in, hop-off trip, meaning, if you have friends or family along the way, by all means stop and visit and then catch up with the group when you can. Signups for the trip will be will available on the website in the near future. Hope you'll consider joining us! It'll be here before you know it!




