#### **NCM News**

This month we have some news so new it has not been made public, some old news and new news about Corvette colors and finally a reminder about the Museum's biggest event of the year.

#### **Corvette Assembly Plant Tours**

At the request of the Corvette assembly plant, the National Corvette Museum will take over all plant tours, including the general public tours. Implementation will be very soon, but an exact date has not been set.

The NCM will be using their new Altru system for booking and scheduling tours. Visitors will be able to sign up on the Museum website, purchase tickets at admissions at the NCM or at the plant, if available.

The folks at the Museum are excited to take on this new opportunity, and plant officials are happy to focus on building Corvettes and letting the NCM handle the tourism side for them. Speaking of building Corvettes...

#### Cancelled 2016 Colors Up To Four

Chevrolet has already ceased production of two 2016 colors, and now two more are going to bite the dust.

The last Night Race Blue rolled off the assembly lines in Bowling Green on January 7, a Z06 Coupe for export. This is to be followed by the last Daytona Sunrise Orange Metallic, which was rolled off the line on Monday, February 15th - a Stingray Z51 Coupe.

Next to leave the color line-up for 2016 are Shark Gray and Laguna Blue. Shark Gray is slated to phase out in May and the last day to order it will be April 15. Laguna Blue will be phased out with the end of the 2016 model year. The last day to order it is April 28.

It is not unusual for Corvette to drop low volume colors, even after only one year. However, Shark Gray was the third most popular color in 2015 which makes its demise puzzling. Also, it is certainly a rarity for four colors to be dropped in a single model year.

Chevrolet has not yet said what prompted the particular colors to get the ax, nor have they announced the 2017 model-year line up, but you can bet there will be samples of any newbies at the Michelin NCM Bash April 28-30. Kickoff of the NCM on site event season - Bash traditionally marks the roll out of the next model year Corvette; the place where you can see them up close and in detail. Bash 2016 will provide enthusiasts the chance to see the new 2017 Corvette Stingray up close as well as getting all the latest information about the all new 7th Generation Corvette. Seminars will feature speakers discussing 'What's new in the 2017 model year', the award winning body structure, as well as using your 7th generation navigation system. As in past years there will be a large contingent of GM engineers and designers from Warren Tech Center, Milford Proving Grounds and the Bowling Green Assembly Plant, ready to answer your every question. Also back to the Bash is our LT4 building demonstration by BGAP Rob Nichols and Brian Lee.

Returning activities include a seminar and classroom sessions by GM certified Corvette Technicians Paul Koerner & Brittany George. Enjoy some guided road tours, two celebrity choice award shows, the Ladies' Oasis, and the expanded Garage Party with women of the GM Corvette Team. The ladies will cover all aspects of Corvettes including maintenance, engineering and even high performance driving. Some returning activities include golf with GM Team.

On-line registration closes at 8:00 a.m. Central Time on Wednesday, April 13. All activities are open to Event Registrants only. On-line registrants will receive a hardcard credential, lanyard, event pin and dash plaque. Lifetime registration is \$15 per person, member registration is \$20 per person and non-member registration is \$30 per person.

### 2016 Mid-America Road Trip

This year's big trip will leave Saturday, July 30<sup>th</sup>, and return Wednesday, August 10<sup>th</sup>. In the interest of controlling space in the monthly newsletter, I am highlighting a few of the trip's points of interest each month. Refer to the December and January newsletters for previous trip highlights.

The trip is continuing to come together and I am now working through outlining the trip routing and itinerary. For those just starting to hear about the trip, we will be heading north to Michigan and Wisconsin to the Road America racetrack located in Elkhart Lake, WI.

Although the Road America Race in Elkhart Lake, WI may be the ultimate destination of the trip, we plan to see a lot of cool things along the way:

- Indianapolis Motor Speedway
- Auburn Cord Duesenberg Automobile Museum
- Tour the General Motors Heritage Center
- Tour Pratt & Miller (produces C7R racing engines)
- Bronner's Christmas Wonderland is the world's largest Christmas store
- Traverse City While known for being the largest producer of tart cherries, this cute town located on Grand Traverse Bay offers tons of shopping, restaurants and cool weather
- Explore Leelanau Peninsula

Sleeping Bear Dunes is as old as continental ice sheets. The most prominent features, and those for which the park is named, are the dunes perched above Lake Michigan. These immense sand dunes are "perched" atop the already towering headlands that are glacial moraines. The dune overlooks at the Sleeping Bear, Empire and Pyramid Point bluffs are about 400 feet above Lake Michigan. For those who want to exert a little energy, the Dune Climb offers plenty of pure, wind-blown sand for your climbing pleasure. (See photo below)



Leelanau Wine Trail with cool-climate is home to 24 wineries located within diverse microclimates uniquely suited for a variety of wine grapes. Among the internationally acclaimed varietals are Riesling, Pinot Grigio, Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Cabernet Franc.



State Hwy "M-119", the famed "Tunnel of Trees" is named for the hardwoods and evergreens that crowd up to the edge of the road, their crowns knit into a comforting ceiling over motorists and bicyclists. But this isn't like a tunnel through a mountain, where the view is basically the inside of a cave. M-119 hugs the eastern shoreline of Lake Michigan through a dense forest. On one side you get glimpses of old summer cabin homes tucked back in the forest and on the other side you get brief glimpses of the Lake Michigan shoreline. This is a very narrow and twisty road that runs through the dense forest of trees and is literally one of those roads that you always see photos in travel magazines that make you crave to drive down. You look ahead of you down the narrow tunnel of trees road and cannot help but wonder what will be around the next curve; it is the road that you always kind of dream of finding when driving a Corvette.



#### Visit to Mackinac Island (no cars allowed)

**Mackinac Island** is an island and resort area, covering 3.8 square miles in land area. It is located in <u>Lake Huron</u>, at the eastern end of the <u>Straits of Mackinac</u>, between the state's <u>Upper</u> and <u>Lower Peninsulas</u>. The island was home to an <u>Odawa</u> settlement before European exploration began in the 17th century. It served a strategic position as a center on the commerce of the <u>Great Lakes fur trade</u>. This led to the establishment of <u>Fort Mackinac</u> on the island by the <u>British</u> during the <u>American Revolutionary War</u>. It was the site of two battles during the <u>War of 1812</u>.

In the late 19th century, Mackinac Island became a popular tourist attraction and <u>summer colony</u>. Much of the island has undergone extensive historical preservation and restoration; as a result, the entire island is listed as a <u>National Historic Landmark</u>. It is well known for its numerous cultural events; its wide variety of architectural styles, including the famous <u>Victorian Grand Hotel</u>; its <u>fudge</u>; and its ban on almost all motor vehicles. More than 80 percent of the island is preserved as <u>Mackinac Island State Park</u>.

- Hold our breath over the famous Mackinaw Bridge aka The Mighty Mac
- Traverse down through Wisconsin and visit Camp Anokijig (one of the C7R Racing team members is heavily involved in this boy's camp; we have a list of needed items and a great start on our LSCC donation)

- Shop at Mid-America store in Effingham, IL on our way back home so leave room in the trunk

## North Texas Basset Hound Rescue is organized for the following purposes:

- 1. Prevent cruelty to animals, specifically basset hounds;
- 2. Support animal welfare by locating and retrieving homeless, unwanted and/or mistreated basset hounds;
- 3. Provide necessary funding for medical care, spaying and neutering, for unwanted and/or mistreated basset hounds; and
- 4. Place homeless, unwanted, and or mistreated canine basset hounds in permanent, loving homes.

The general area of rescue is the Fort Worth and Dallas area, but we also cover many shelters in North Texas from Abilene to Waco, Longview to the Oklahoma border. All animals are given medical care including spay/neuter, heartworm treatment, dental care and micro-chipping. Providing information on spay/neuter programs, micro-chipping, and participating in responsible pet ownership events lets us achieve

our goals of rescuing Basset Hounds and serving the community. Rescue volunteers receive no compensation for their countless hours and transportation costs. NTBHR is very fortunate to have several veterinarians who provide excellent treatment at a reduced rate. The rewards of a rescue volunteer come from knowing that a basset is getting a second chance and from a slobbery lick and a wagging tail.

North Texas Basset Hound Rescue (NTBHR) rescued and rehomed 99 Basset Hounds in 2015 at an expense of \$800/dog. We rarely kennel our dogs. Most are fostered so we can evaluate them and make a good match with an applicant. We have 20-25 active fosters, but we always need more. We also have 10-15 volunteers performing other needs associated with the rescue. We host two fundraisers each year:

Bone Soiree: live and silent auction with plated dinner (April 30, 2016 at Lewisville Convention Center).

Basset Hound Shuffle: Outside Park for games, events, contests (longest ears, weenie toss, etc.) raffle, demonstrations, lunch for humans and hounds! (Oct. 22, 2016 at Leon Hogg Amphitheater, Euless)

We host several meet/greet events for potential adopters and for the general public. We receive invitations to join other groups at an event such as a book signing. Maybe someday we can have a "Vette and Hound day event" putting fancy cars with sweet and funny bassets!

It all started with a dream that we could see a no kill society in our lifetime, and that one of the biggest hunting and outdoor enthusiast's states in the US would embrace its Sporting Breeds and support our efforts in saving them. Driven by these hopes and founded by a group of dedicated volunteers we set out on the "Mission" of Texas Sporting Breed Rescue (TSBR).

To provide for the welfare, shelter and adoption of lost, abandoned, neglected, or homeless dogs and puppies, specifically; The American Kennel Club (AKC) 29 defined sporting group breeds - Retrievers, Setters, Pointers, Spaniels, Vizlas, Weimaraners, and Spinone Italianos; to promote the responsible care of companion animals, to actively promote spaying and neutering as the most humane means of animal control; to support heartworm education and treatment; and to provide training and education to the public related to topics such as: animal welfare, responsible dog ownership and breed information.

TSBR is a young organization; founded in early 2011 to address the continued shortage of rescue organizations available in Texas to support the 28 AKC designated Sporting Breeds. We have carefully chosen a group of highly

experienced, animal welfare driven, fiscally responsible; community based volunteers to lead our organization, and to help bring our mission statement into fruition. Our leadership is comprised of both a board of directors as well as a critical advisory committee, bringing together the experience and expertise of Veterinarians, Corporate CFOs, Accountants, Lawyers, Dog Trainers, as well as representatives from the sporting community.

As rescuers, we have diligently supported our local shelters and their volunteers in the rescue and re-homing of many animals, and our commitment is to continue this aide to the animals in our communities. Being rescuers of sporting breed dogs, we have the unique challenge of assisting with the re-homing of several of the top breeds in the United States, including Pointers, Labrador, and Golden Retrievers.

Anyone that has owned or worked with this group of dogs knows that these dogs make a difference in the lives of those that love them, work with them, work for them, and depend on them. We sincerely hope to return that favor to them! We care about the dogs, the communities we serve, and the people whose lives we touch. Help us make a difference!

For those who enjoy it, there is nothing better than a day of fishing and relaxing - connecting with the outdoors and enjoying the company of like-minded friends. For our nation's warriors and their families, it's more than an enjoyable day. It's a rehabilitative, sometimes life-saving, event. Heroes on the Water provide free, therapeutic kayak fishing to our veterans and active military and their families because we understand the impact. A recent 18 month study confirmed the impact the program has on our veterans. Our heroes experienced 56% less stress than before participating in these outdoor therapeutic outings. Many of the individuals who had experienced intense trauma from their service were only able to get a couple of hours of sleep in a given night. Sleep is essential to every individual's overall health. These nightmares and

re-experiences prevented our warriors from sleeping decreased by 60%. Now, instead of less than 2 hours of sleep a night, they were getting 5 or more. Can you imagine the sense of relief these brave men and women must feel after such drastic and remarkable physical changes? We also saw a 63% drop in avoidance from their family and comrades. They not only reconnected with themselves, but also with those who care about them.

That day was the first time I had seen my husband in a new light. He was smiling, socializing and talked about his experience the whole way home."

Rick Herrick, President, introduced the six rotating charities presenting to the LSCC Membership.

- 1. YMCA Camp Grady Spruce presented a video about their camp and how it impacts children.
- 2. Assistance League of Greater Collin County operates the Operation School Bell. This organization provides new clothing and hygiene kits to elementary school children at the beginning of the school year. It costs \$100 per child which includes a shoe voucher. They also do other programs such as Caps for Kids with Cancer, Meals on Wheels, etc.
- Minnie's Food Pantry is located in Plano, Texas. They serve 3,000 families a month. Their mission is HOPE (Helping Other People Eat). Their food is donated and purchased. Every family receives 60 pounds of food a month.
- 4. Texas Sporting Breed Rescue, Inc. serves all of Texas. Their mission is to provide Heart (Hope, Education, Advocacy, Rescue, Training). The majority of their dogs are brought to them by direct contact by shelter personnel, breeder, owners or walking shelters. In 2015, they rescued 146 dogs.
- Heroes on the Water were founded in the DFW metroplex. This program is to help warriors relax, rehabilitate and reintegrate through kayak fishing and the outdoors.
- North Texas Basset Hound Rescue mission is to rescue, place and provide foster homes for Basset Hounds. They rescued 99 Basset Hounds in 2015.

Rick asked all LSCC members with birthdays in February to stand and we all sang Happy Birthday to them.

Rick thanked Classic Chevrolet and The Thompson Group Classic Chevrolet for their sponsorship.

With no further business to discuss, the Business meeting was adjourned at 1:32 p.m.




