# Navigating New Members Phil Key

LSCC would like new members to feel welcomed and become involved. Seminars will feature speakers discussing 'What's new in the 2018 model year', as well as using your 7th generation navigation system. As in past years there will be a large contingent of GM engineers and designers from Warren Tech Center, and the Bowling Green Assembly Plant ready to answer your every question.

If there is truth to the rumors about a new ZR1, or a midengined Corvette, this is where you will see and touch it.

A special one-time event at this year's Bash will be the Corvette Racing recognition dinner. This will honor Doug Fehan, Gary Pratt, Jim Miller and all of Corvette Racing for their many successes, including their 100th victory and IMSA championship this year. If you are a fan of Corvette racing this is a not to miss opportunity. Most, if not all of the Corvette Racing team will be there.

#### **NCM's First Curator**

After twenty-two years of operation the National Corvette Museum FINALLY named a curator. It is an exciting time to have a person whose only task is to make the "museum" part of our Museum world class.

Derek E. Moore assumed the curator position on March 6. He previously served as the curator of transportation history at the Western Reserve Historical Society in Cleveland, Ohio.

At Western Reserve, Moore was responsible for researching the history of automobiles and aviation of Cleveland and Northeast Ohio, developing exhibits and programming on the history of automobiles, aircraft and related transportation technologies. In addition, Moore created and maintained records on the collection, developed lectures, essays and summaries for use in exhibits and publications and was responsible for the conservation and preservation of the 150+ collection of historic vehicles and aircraft.

Prior to his employment at the Western Reserve Historical Society, he served in several roles including Conservation Specialist of the Transportation Collection at The Henry Ford in Dearborn, MI and interned at the Alfred P. Sloan Museum in Flint, MI.

As Curator for the National Corvette Museum, Moore willbe responsible for researching, developing and producing exhibits as well as the planning, acquisition and/or loan, safe-keeping and cataloging of collection objects and vehicles related to Corvette history.

"The National Corvette Museum is one of the most welcoming environments I've experienced. It is an incredible museum and is so unique in that it is focused on one community – and it has that community feeling about it," said Moore. "One of the biggest challenges currently facing museums is the decreasing number of visitors. Younger generations are losing interest in museums as they turn to more and more handheld technology. To bring them back to the museums, we need to work with that technology and I look forward to helping the NCM add cutting edge technology that will help freshen up the exhibits and get younger generations excited about visiting the museum."

Moore grew up in St. Charles, MI and is a graduate of Eastern Michigan University of Ypsilanti, MI with a Bachelor of Science in History. He is a member of the Society of Automotive Engineers, serves as Treasurer of the National Association of Automobile Museums, and is a past board member of the National Automotive History Collection at the Detroit Public Library.

He and fiancée, Christine Bobco, are auto enthusiasts and currently own several antique vehicles including a 1917 Overland, 1923 Peerless, and a 1961 Ford Falcon, and hope to be adding a Corvette to their collection soon.



# NCM Motorsports Park HPDE Track Day June 5th & 6th



The National Corvette Museum embarked on one of the most exciting and significant expansion projects in the nearly 20-year history of the Museum when on June 28, 2013 it broke ground on a 184 acre Motorsports Park. The \$20 million, dual-track attraction will provide motorsports enthusiasts with a new favorite destination. The two circuits, "East" and "West" can be combined into multiple configurations ranging from a high speed loop of 1.96 miles to an extended 3.15 mile technical course. The teams at Corvette Racing and Pratt and Miller advised the Museum on the layout, incorporating features from their most challenging track, the Le Mans circuit. The facility welcomes all makes and models of vehicles, including motorcycles.



LSCC was instrumental in donating land during the construction of the NCM Motorsports Park and earned several private track days in the process. 


