### **Navigating New Members**

LSCC would like new members to feel welcomed and become involved. A proposal that resulted from the February 25th Brainstorming Meeting was to implement a "Navigator" or "Buddy" Program" to help new members get all the support and enjoyment that comes from being part of our LSCC family. We also recognize that new members bring new ideas to our Club, and we want to benefit from their input. Helping new members find their way benefits all of us. Remember, all of us had or still have buddies who made us feel welcomed.

The role of the Navigator or Buddy is make sure the new member feels welcomed, to inform and educate them about Club activities that are available, and to make sure they meet all of the respective coordinators. The Navigator would ensure new members understand how to access and use the LSCC website. Perhaps the key role of the Navigator is to encourage new members to have fun attending meetings, participating in events and making good friends. With all being said, the Navigator must display passionate salesmanship based upon experience as well as knowledge.

To implement this program, we want to geographically match Navigators with new members so that their "face time" outside of meetings is more readily accomplished. This means Navigators will be recruited from all areas of the Metroplex and greater north Texas.

Limited to only 650 numbered vehicles globally, the distinctive Carbon 65 blends visible carbon-fiber exterior elements — notably, a new carbon-fiber rear spoiler and quarter ducts — with a new Ceramic Matrix Gray exterior color and special interior appointments, including a new carbon-fiber-rimmed steering wheel.

Speeds in Autocross are slower, in absolute terms, when compared to other forms of racing but the activity level, measured in discrete turns per minute, can be higher than even Formula One due to the large number of elements packed into each course. It will be a good time to get ready for the LSCC Classic. The donation is \$15 per car. Helmets are required but loaners are available.

Rally, the club does not sponsor rallies at this time but I will tell you about the SCCA group that will be holding the "Tulip Time Rally" on Saturday, May 27th. It starts in Mesquite, and ends in McKinney. It is our annual Tulip Time Rally, named for the spring flower and the "Tulip" instructions that we will be using. The details are on the attached flier. You are welcome to pass the flier on to anyone you think might enjoy a fun day on country roads, with a few mental challenges thrown in.Twothirds of the rally will be on roads we have not used in current memory. Some of them are scenic and/or curvy, and some of them have plenty of bluebonnets along the way...but I am afraid those will be gone by rally day.

I know it's early, but it helps us to plan the event if we can predict how many will be there. And even though the registration system "requires" you to give your credit card info, you are not billed until a day or two after the event, and then only if you actually take the start.

We will, at least for the time being, continue to allow drivers to maintain their driver profile on our web site. However, payment and registration for events will be processed through our partners at MotorsportReg.com. June 24 is on the 1.7 mile track.

### NCM Motorsports Park HPDE Track Day June 5th & 6th



The National Corvette Museum embarked on one of the most exciting and significant expansion projects in the nearly 20-year history of the Museum when on June 28, 2013 it broke ground on a 184 acre Motorsports Park. The \$20 million, dual-track attraction will provide motorsports enthusiasts with a new favorite destination. The two circuits, "East" and "West" can be combined into multiple configurations ranging from a high speed loop of 1.96 miles to an extended 3.15 mile technical course. The teams at Corvette Racing and Pratt and Miller advised the Museum on the layout, incorporating features from their most challenging track, the Le Mans circuit. The facility welcomes all makes and models of vehicles, including motorcycles.



LSCC was instrumental in donating land during the construction of the NCM Motorsports Park and earned several private track days in the process. So, we will be traveling to Bowling Green to "cash-in" on two of those days. We will have the entire park to ourselves! Imagine traveling to Disney World and having free run of the Park. It's kind of like that, but only better.

Some headed out early and others later but the main group met up in Daphne, AL on March 9<sup>th</sup> to a festive evening of free drinks and food at a hotel with a beautiful view of Mobile Bay and a majestic sunset. LSCC Lot Lizards made it a great party atmosphere to start off the trip!

The next morning several folks visited the USS Alabama just a short drive from our hotel; she won nine Battle Stars and shot down 22 enemy plans during WWII. Suzanna Main and I rode bikes around the scenic trails of D'Olive Creek where we came across two alligators along the Gator Alley Boardwalk to our delight.



After the USS Alabama visit, we gathered the four caravan groups and headed for Jacksonville, FL picking up the Powells, Club members who live in Florida, along the way. There were traffic issues on I-10 so the Powells lead us on delightful scenic detour via US-90.

We met up with more folks in Jacksonville including David Orrick's son, Justin, who flew in for several days of the trip... being the youngest on the trip and fit right in. Also the Fosnights from Huntsville, AL (Bob Paton's sister and brother-in-law) joined us for most of the trip. With the threat of a Sunday rain, the infamous Concourse d'Elegance was moved up to Saturday so some of us actually went to it along with attending Cars and Coffee event. What a treat to view cars invited to participate from all over the world. The cars were staged on the Ritz Carlton's golf course. What a setting to experience a car show of this caliber!

The next day many headed out to the oldest continuously inhabited city in the US, St. Augustine, for a private trolley tour of the city. We learned that Henry Flagler built numerous impressive buildings around the City and later developed the Florida East coast Railway which ran from Jacksonville to Key West; the Labor Day Hurricane of 1935 heavily damaged much of its bridges, but there was much left for us to see on our drive to Key West. The next morning, we all connected at a Travel Plaza in the middle of the Florida Turnpike (benefitting from the Hester's advice to purchase toll tags, or Sun Passes, in advance of the trip)! Our Key West hotel was a perfect, waterfront location so we never needed to drive once we arrived. A few didn't want to leave after a day of meandering up and down Duval Street enjoying wonderful food, people watching and the balmy Caribbean life. 

The next morning we headed out to the Edison & Ford Winter Estates for a private tour of scenic grounds with unique foliage and well-maintained properties beside the Caloosahatchee River. One point I did get out of it was how adventurous the Fords and Edisons were, all their wealth aside! The Fort Myers area was only 300 people back then and a cattle trail divided the property; it was no easy journey to get there. Seeing all of Edison's amazing inventions displayed and viewing his laboratory was fascinating. The Ford compound was directly next door so the Edisons and Fords were close neighbors. It was rumored that one could order a Ford vehicle and go to the local railroad depot to "pick up" the parts to assemble it...thus potentially was coined the term "pickup truck" that we use today. It was also interesting that two such innovative, motivated men were such good friends for so long...to be at one of their lot lizard parties would have been incredible!

Next some of us headed out for another private tour of Ca' d'Zan (meaning "house of John"), the winter home of John and Mable Ringling of Ringling Bros Circus fame. What a home it was, right on Sarasota Bay, of unique Venetian Gothic Revival architecture, and what a contrast to the Ford/Edison estates, especially given this was built in 1911 versus late 1800's. The home was right on the water and although unique, very worth seeing! The circus museum and grounds were equally as interesting. A few folks even managed to squeeze in a visit to the Don Garlits museum in Ocala. Like most days, we rarely avoided hours of driving but folks were troopers; there was just no way to see all we did in that amount of time without driving the distances in-between.

The next day held an unexpected surprise...We avoided I-10 as we headed home along the Florida panhandle on US-98 only to end up driving right along the coastline on another gorgeous sunny day. The Sunshine Tour was blessed with only sunshine and no rain!! We ate in a wonderful restaurant in Apalachicola where we celebrated Mike Woolsey's birthday and made our waitress' day for doing a parade lap by the restaurant as we left town (she texted me later how cool thawas)! Oysters are famous here and Rick said they were delicious!



We were off to navigate more spring break crowds as we headed to Destin but again once there, we didn't need to drive as Ken Smith had found us a hotel within walking distance of several great fish restaurants and great shopping. We had several of wonderful fish meals on this trip, some I'd never heard of before like trigger fish and of course ate some alligator/chicken. Every now and then a burger was awfully good though.

With another free day along the Destin Bay waterfront, folks seemed to enjoy visiting and just relaxing as the trip came to an end. And even more hardy souls took a drive to the Naval Aviation Museum where Mike Hill coordinated a special tour of the museum!
