I make no pretense of being an accurate predictor of future technology. After all, I bought a Betamax. I'm all for progress, but in the entertainment business that progress needs to be in the form of a more enhanced viewing experience.

I recently labored through a telecast of Formula E race, aka high-tech golf carts. OK, I understand that motorsports are under some pressure to improve their e-appeal, and the Formula E thing may well be the answer. Sure, it presents these races deep inside the host cities, which makes a lot of e-sense to avail it for fans to attend via mass transit. I guess there's something to be said for Formula E for the relatively short tracks, so you get to see your favorite e-cars close up more frequently. But, by being in the inner city, the narrow and deep track conjured visions of test rats in a maze. Then there's the sandbox factor, in which the teams have a testing place to develop better batteries and drive trains. Despite all the e-appeal of Formula E, the seemingly unsolvable shortcoming to this viewer is the e-Sound. All of the e-goodness fails to compensate for the loss of one of the greatest dimensions of auto racing: the R-sound, the vroom. The cars of F1, Indy and IMSA teams have distinct voices. One can stand anywhere at a road course track and tell, with near precision, where the Corvettes are on the track. And, the distinctive high-rev sound of the Ferrari's is unmistakable. Without these varied voices of the cars, Formula E presently is like watching slow motion Formula 1 in black & white.

Nominations begin soon! Many current officers will term out, meaning they've served their maximum number of terms and can't run for reelection. If you or someone you know has been a member in good standing for at least one year, and you have a talent or energy that might benefit the Club...the future of LSCC needs YOU and your fresh perspectives. #### **Corvette Production Update**

2018 Corvette production began June 8. It was scheduled to cease temporarily July 28. The plant will be closed for 13 weeks. During that time the assembly line will be revamped to incorporate the new state-of-theart paint shop.

2017 production concluded on June 5. Shortly after, General Motors released final production stats. The total production of 32,782 is down from 2016's 40,689. However, 2018 production started almost two months early, cutting 2017 production time to only about 10 months. Per month totals work out to about 3,390 for 2016 and 3,280 for 2017. Following are some of the highlights.

Both Black Rose and Sterling Blue have been discontinued. In 2016, Arctic White was also #1, followed by Black and Torch Red.

Corvette offered 29 interior color options so I will not list them. However, some form of black was chosen in over 50% of the cars sold, followed by Adrenaline Red.

Another interesting stat is that the 8 speed automatic outsold the manual transmission in the Z06 for the second year in a row.

Speeds in Autocross are slower, in absolute terms, when compared to other forms of racing but the activity level, measured in discrete turns per minute, can be higher than even Formula One due to the large number of elements packed into each course. #### **New Coordinators Needed!**


It's time for you to get involved!




# 27<sup>th</sup> Annual Eureka Springs Corvette Weekend

In fact, he continued with a teeny-weeny tear in his eye and stumble in his voice "LSCC has never won the club participation award. Even when we had 60 plus cars, Tulsa Vette Set always beat us out". With that, I was thinking it would sure be cool if LSCC could bring home that elusive plaque. After all this will be the 20<sup>th</sup> attempt. Now for the pitch, "Let's win this one for JD".

LSCC Corvettes Signed Up for 2017 Eureka Springs Corvette Weekend

Goal

So how are we going to win the club participation? We're going to cheat by bringing the most cars; pretty simple don't you think. Here is what I need you to do as a LSCC member. Go the LSCC web page and sign-in as a member, scroll down to the 26<sup>th</sup> Annual Eureka Springs Corvette Weekend information panel, hit the "register here" button. You are now where you can sign up and view all the hotel information. I will be notified via email once you register and will contact everyone via email with further details.

Out of all the events LSCC attends, this one is probably the most unique. Unique in the sense that seven Corvette clubs come together to put on the four-day event. Here is a list of the clubs and the events they provide: 1) Central Arkansas Corvette Club (Rides for Kids); (2) Kansas City Corvette Assoc. (Show & Blindman Autocross); (3) Lone Star Corvette Club (Poker Run); (4) Northwest Arkansas Corvette Club (Parade of Champions); (5) Tulsa Vette Set (Fuel Economy Run); (6) Air Capital Corvette Club (Nursing Home Private Show); and (7) Razorback Corvette Club (Registration).

Kristina and I have been LSCC members for nearly 10 years and I think this will be our 8th year attending this event, so we obviously have enjoyed it as have many others who've been going much longer than we have! © If you have never been on a LSCC caravan, I would like to reach out and invite you to a super fun trip this October. After all, who does not like to drive the best car made on some of the most beautiful roads in America, enjoy lies with friends during a nice meal and sharing in a well-run, activity-filled weekend with other Corvette enthusiasts. If this has a spark of interest, well, all you need to do is sign up on the LSCC website, book a hotel and save the date.

As you can see from the website, as in the past, we will have two departure dates. The shortest, most direct route leaves on Thursday, October 5th, and is mostly on divided highways and typically includes the scenic Pig Trail Byway through the Boston Mountains.

For those who have an extra day and want to experience some additional beauty, curvy roads and desire a little culture, we will leave on Wednesday, October 4th. Caravans on both days will gather and leave from the Oklahoma welcome Center; however, the earlier one will head for Broken Bow where we will stop for lunch. After lunch, we will head north thru Ouachita National Forest to our hotel in Rogers, AR. After a restful night, we will head to Bentonville to visit the Walmart Museum and Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art. A sit down lunch is being planned at the Eleven Restaurant in the Crystal Bridges Museum. After lunch, we are looking into two private museum tours: the "Collection Highlights" and the "Temporary Exhibition" (Chihuly: In the Forest). <a href="https://www.crystalbridges.org">www.crystalbridges.org</a>. From there we will head to our hotel in Eureka Springs.

If this will be the first time for you to Eureka Springs, there are lots of things to check out in the well-preserved town set in the Ozark Mountains of northwest Arkansas. A trolley is available from most hotels to take you off for wonderful day of shopping and investigating all the historical gems of this idyllic town. A short drive out of town will take you to Thorncrown Chapel, War Eagle mill, Turpentine Wild Cat Refuge or the suspended bridge, as a small sample of ideas.







Highlights of the Corvette-related events include the fuel economy run on Friday morning (navigates about 80 miles of scenic country roads; you compete with others in your class for the best fuel economy) and a scenic photo run the same day. Of course the car show is Saturday morning followed by the poker run and parade of champions that evening. By the way, we'd love to have LSCC volunteers to help put on the Poker Run as that's LSCCs contribution to the weekend...and it is a blast...so be ready to chime in when the time comes! What are you waiting for...let's hit the road and save the wave. You'll get lots of practice waving to Corvettes as you cruise around town!

#### Proposed Amendment to Article XII - Board of Directors Job Descriptions

Section E, Item 5 is amended to read as:

Ensure that Club insurance requirements are met for Club sanctioned events that meet coverage criteria as outlined by the Club's insurance carrier. This includes ensuring that event coordinators complete the required Independent Club Event Liability (ICEL) forms and collect the required, current, properly formatted, and signed waivers from event participants. With no further business to discuss, the Business meeting was adjourned at 12:35 p.m.








