Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

**Day Trips** – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

**Open Road Racing** – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just "click" on "Open Road Racing".

**Drag Racing** – Want to "go fast" join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

**Autocross** – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

**NCRS** – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in the Dallas Autorama. On the first Saturday of each month, you'll find a bunch of us at Cars & Coffee in Plano, "kicking tires" and telling tall tales about our cars.

**Displays and Parades** – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

**Club Meetings** – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

#### **NCM News**

The fourth quarter board meeting of the National Corvette Museum was held in early December. This was my final board meeting as my ten year term on the Board has come to an end. So this will be the last NCM News with "inside" information from the Board.

#### **Corvette Hall of Fame**

One of our most important duties at this meeting was the election of inductees to the Corvette Hall of Fame. Three are chosen, one each in the categories of Racing, GM/Chevrolet, and Enthusiast. They will be inducted at the 2018 ceremony on Friday, August 31, 2018. This is during the NCM 24<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration.

John and Burt Greenwood were chosen in the category of Racing. Their story goes back childhood when their dad, Hank, would take them to work with him to the GM Tech Center. Exposure to the cars there sparked an obsession for all things automotive.

John grew to be a gifted, self-taught engineer and a fiercely competitive street racer in his 1964 Corvette. This led to starting a shop called Auto Research Engineering, where he did performance work for his competitors, which would ultimately help him finance his racing career.

John's first National Championship came in 1970, during his first full year of competition. He followed that up with victories in 1971 at the endurance races in Sebring and Watkins Glen, leading to a 2nd National SCCA Championship. Many victories would follow including the 1975 TransAm Driver Championship and Manufacturer Championship for Corvette.

All along, John's brother Burt, was an integral part of the team. He was the "rule guy" going over all the racing regulations, looking for any angle to give his brother an edge. He became a student of aerodynamics, taking what he learned on the track and applying it to the Greenwood street cars. Working together with a team of dedicated mechanics and some covert help on the side from GM Designers and Engineers, the Greenwood brothers made racing history.

The GM/Chevrolet selection is **Tom Wallace**, who, along with Zora Arkuus-Duntov, are the only two who have been race car drivers <u>AND</u> Corvette Chief Engineers.

Tom has always been a car guy, going back to high-school when he gained a reputation for being the one to beat in a drag race. As he got older he would go on to drive professionally competing in the 24 Hours of Daytona, 12 Hours of Sebring and the Talladega 6-Hour race.

He took his passion and knowledge of performance and applied it to a career at General Motors. He would go on to become Vehicle Line Executive for Performance cars and then as the Chief Engineer from 2005 to 2008 for the Corvette.

During a dark time in automotive history, when the future of GM was in question, Tom surprised the world and pulled together the resources to lead a team on a mission to create the fastest, most balanced, most capable Corvette ever made to that point. It was the 2009 638 hp, 200+ mph ZR1 Corvette.

In the category of Enthusiast **Mike Yager** is an obvious choice. He bought his first Corvette in 1970 when he was just 20 years old. He made the observation that there wasn't a place where a Corvette fan could purchase Corvette merchandise. To remedy that, he bought whatever he could find that related to Corvette and started making it available at his Corvette club events and car shows. When that worked out, he got a \$500 loan to start a company that has now grown to become one of the world's largest suppliers of parts and accessories for Corvettes... Mid America Motorworks.

Mike's love for Corvettes did not stop there. To thank his customers, he started *Funfest*, which brings together thousands of Corvette people each year for a good time that ends with a concert featuring bands like the Beach Boys. He has been a part of numerous clubs and organizations, including the National Corvette Museum where he served as its Chairman of the Board in 2002. He was also behind "Drive Your Corvette to Work Day" and organized an effort to have a commemorative stamp created to celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Corvette. While he was at it, he got behind a campaign to honor Corvette's birthday with a National Day of Recognition.

#### **Corvette Assembly**

One of my favorite parts of the NCM Board meetings are



the reports by Kai Spande, Corvette Plant Manager. It is always enlightening, and usually positive.

The December report had one bit of bad news. The plant will be closed to tours until January 2019. No good reason given, which means to me that they definitely will be building more of those mid-engined cars we have seen spy photos of.

The really good news is about paint. While the plant was shut down for three months, the decision was made to produce all colors in the new paint shop when the plant restarted production. So, all of the cars produced after the November restart will have the new, state of the art, exceptionally high quality paint application. Actually, after the new assembly line got up and running, 80 for sale cars were produced in October – all with new paint shop panels.

The plant is producing 70 cars per day. The goal is to slowly ramp up to a goal of 93 per day by February. Some of the cars being built now are 2019 models for the GM test fleet.

Forty-six of those cars, so far, are ZR1's. Speaking of ZR1's, they will be on constraint from the beginning of production. The reason is the high number of ZR1 specific parts, including the hood and front fascia. The low production capacity on these parts will limit the ZR1 to about 10% of total Corvette build. That would be about nine cars per day, so get your order placed at Classic/Thompson now!

Don't forget, if you are a member of the NCM, you can get GM supplier pricing on all 2018 and 2019 Corvettes. So, if you're going to buy, join or renew with the Museum first. Supplier pricing is available on 2017's also, but Thompson/Classic will give you at least GM employee pricing on that year model.



#### **Open Road Racing**

The competitive events season starts on January 2nd with registration for the Big Bend Open Road Race. Race dates for 2018 are April 18th - 21st.

The race takes place on Highway 285 South from Fort Stockton to Sanderson and the highway is closed by police for the race. The race is round-trip (for a total of 118 miles) with drivers selecting speed classes from 85 to unlimited and then trying to average this speed over the distance of the race. Each year this event brings hundreds of people from all over the US and Europe to these Big Bend area communities for several days of racing, parties and fun. The BBORR has something for everyone so make plans to be a part of this exciting event in West Texas.

The number of competitors is very limited so early registration is crucial. If you have any questions check out <a href="https://www.bborr.com">www.bborr.com</a> or contact Mike Black, our open road racing coordinator and past winner of this event..

This year's Big Bend Open Road Race will have something for everyone, so make plans now to be a part of this exciting event in West Texas. The event starts off in Sanderson on Wednesday, and Thursday with activities for the racers including registration, technical inspection, rookie school, practice runs, and qualifying. A Welcome Party will be held on Thursday at 5 p.m.

On Friday, the activities move to Fort Stockton for additional racer functions and a Car Show from 4:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. in Rooney Park. Everyone is invited to come and meet the drivers and see their cars.

On Saturday, the Annual After Race Party in the Park will be held in Rooney Park from 12:30 – 5:30 p.m. The racers will end up here after they cross the finish line. There will be music, food, and drinks and lot and lots of FUN!!! 
#### **High Performance Driving Education**

These events continue through the winter season but as always you have to register well in advance. The morning starts out with driver's meeting. Drivers are already



pre-assigned into one of three or four different levels of run groups (pending event) with in-car instructors assigned accordingly. Each run group has instructional classes each day in-between their 4 to 5 on-track run sessions over the course of the day. Each time a Beginner or Novice driver goes on the track they will have an assigned instructor seated beside them for live feedback, guidance, instruction and evaluation at the end of the course to be able to further guide us in serving your performance driving needs. This is a great way to learn about your car and what it and you can do!

Special announcement: Mike has arranged for us to try a club day at Motor Sports Park in Cresson. March 17th is the date. Bottom line is we must have 20+ cars to make this work with 32 cars max and it means putting money up front.... but it's much cheaper too....only \$95. The price is going up the first of the year but JC will hold the price for our group if we will commit to the date. Ladies will run separate from the guys in their own run group. Contact Mike ASAP as payment needs to be made the first of March. This is a one day event that you shouldn't miss.



Our other competitive events will start up again in March and April. Autocross had 46 different participants last season and we would like to see even greater participation this year. The drag racers won 1st place last season and they are always looking for more people that love to punch it when the light turns green so get your cars ready and come out and join in the fun.





Serve as coordinator or assistant coordinator for the LSCC volunteers, or coordinate delivery of items donated to the organization.

Requests for assistance will be reviewed prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> month of each calendar quarter, and the approved requests will be announced at the 1<sup>st</sup> Club Meeting of each quarter. At that meeting, plans for providing assistance to the approved organization will be presented to the Membership.



## **NCRS Top Flight Award**

Two members of LSCC, Don Brumbaugh and Lee Brumit participated in the NCRS National Convention held in San Antonio in July and were rewarded for their efforts with Top Flight Ribbons and Certificates.

Don Brumbaugh displayed his 1962 Corvette. It is Sateen Silver with black interior, equipped with a 327 / 360HP Fuel Injection engine, a 4 speed transmission, and also has both a hard top and soft top. Don acquired this Corvette from a long time friend in May 2015, this friend was the original owner and had purchased the Corvette new in Dec. 1961. Don spent about a year to prepare and restore this 1962 to NCRS standards. He had it judged for the first time at the NCRS chapter meet in Houston in April where it scored a 97.9; then went north in June and received a high score Bloomington Gold award. The previous chapter award qualified him to enter the national event in July. The judges at the National Convention again were responsive with a 98.3 score. And to further backup the Corvette's credentials, Don entered the NCRS Regional show held in Frisco at the Enbassy Suites Convention Center in October -- the score this time was a 99.9. Don's plan is to prepare for a Performance Evaluation test, and if successful with that, another National judging event with the goal in mind of receiving a Duntov award.





Lee Brumit entered his 1965 Corvette Coupe. Nassua Blue in color, powered by a 327 / 375HP Fuel Injection engine and a 4 speed transmission. Also equipped with the desirable Kelsey Hayes Knock- Off wheels that were available as an option. 1965 was the last year that Fuel Injection was available; having been offered from 1957 thru 1965. Total production for the 1965 Fuel Injection is listed as 771 units. Lee states that he also has 3 other Corvettes that have achieved Top Flight status. A 1963 Corvette split window coupe Saddle Tan with a leather interior; 327 / 360HP Fuel Injected engine and a 4 speed transmission. A 1967 Corvette coupe in Elkhart Blue with a 427 / 435HP big block engine with the Holley triple carburetors, a 4 speed transmission and the side exhaust system. A 1995 Corvette ZR-1 in Torch Red with a Black interior. This was the last year for the LT5 dual overhead camshafts engines used in the ZR-1, available from 1990 through 1995. Total production for 1995 ZR-1's was 448 Corvettes.


