Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place!

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just click on <u>Open Road Racing</u>.

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in the Dallas Autorama. On the first Saturday of each month, you'll find a bunch of us at Cars & Coffee in Plano, "kicking tires" and telling tall tales about our cars.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

NCM News

This month we have news on the first ZR1 production, a reminder about upcoming events, and reasons to be a member of the National Corvette Museum.

First ZR1 off the Assembly Line

If you subscribe to the NCM e-news you may know about this. In January NASCAR team owner and Chevrolet dealer Rick Hendrick was the winning bidder on the first retail 2019 ZR1 at Barrett-Jackson. The purchase was for \$925,000 with the proceeds benefiting veterans charity Building for America's Bravest through the Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation.

On Wednesday, March 14 Hendrick visited the GM Corvette Assembly Plant to see his ZR1 ceremoniously roll off the line (which was built the first day of ZR1 production, Monday, March 5) and start the car. Afterwards, he visited the Museum for lunch. Corvette plant manager Kai Spande drove Mr. Hendrick's ZR1 from the assembly line to the NCM where the Museum Delivery ceremony took place. Following photo ops Hendrick took some touring laps in a Stingray at the NCM Motorsports Park with other members of the HMS team, as well as a few friends from Nationwide Insurance.

Hendrick's ZR1 is a black on black convertible with Jet Black and Adrenaline Red interior, Suede-Wrapped Upper Interior Trim Package, 3ZR Package, Competition Sport Bucket Seats, Red Seat Belts, Black Badge Package, 8-Speed Automatic Transmission with Paddle Shift, Carbon Fiber Hood, Carbon Fiber Ground Effects Package, ZR1 Carbon Flash-Painted Aluminum Wheels with Red Calipers, Track Performance Package, Performance Ride and Handling Suspension, NPP Performance Exhaust System, Performance Data & Video Recorder and more.

Mr. Hendrick is a member of the NCM Corvette Hall of Fame and a major supporter of the National Corvette Museum.

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For any concerns that I mentioned or may have overlooked, there are plenty of Board members that can help you get a handle on it until you are comfortable doing it yourself.

Excerpted from LSCC Bylaws:

E. The duties of the Recreational Events Officer will include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Coordinate road trips, including trips to car shows with a primary emphasis of fund raising and/or recreation.
- 2. Coordinate car displays.
- 3. Coordinate dinner cruises.
- 4. Coordinate swap meets, detail days, shade tree events, etc.
- 5. Ensure that Club insurance requirements are met for Club sanctioned events that meet coverage criteria as outlined by the Club's insurance carrier. This includes ensuring that event coordinators complete the required Independent Club Event Liability (ICEL) forms and collect the required, current, properly formatted, and signed waivers from event participants. The Recreational Events Officer will submit the completed ICEL to the insurance agent and ensure that all documents are delivered to the Recording Secretary for archival.



How to build a Killer Mobile Set-up for your Corvette

Last month I talked about upgrading to Ham type handheld radio's that will tune to our FRS club channel for greater range and better audio quality. This month I'll show you how to put together a killer mobile radio and antenna setup, all for about \$200 to \$250. But first, I would like to elaborate on last month's article with a few ideas on mounting your current handheld radio in your Corvette.

I am absolutely sold on a magnetic mount made by <u>Scosche</u>. I use them in all my cars to hang on to my phone, my GPS and now my club handheld radio on. They have two styles; one that mounts with <u>double stick</u> tape and the other with a <u>suction cup for flat surface or windshield</u> mount. They use a <u>special (small) metal plate</u> that sticks to your <u>Phone</u> or <u>Radio</u> or whatever, and then the high-powered magnetics in the base takes care of the rest. I give the Scosche Mount two BIG thumbs up! Another option is the <u>ProClip</u>; club member Roger Jones uses this brand <u>in his C6</u> to hold <u>his FRS Radio</u>.



Now getting on with Part II, "Killer Mobile Radio"; last year I lead two, 1 week long MiM tours through 5 National Parks for the NCM. Over the years, Terri and I have been on many club tours and NCM tours all across this country; the one common issue I see is the leader cannot always be heard by the last car in line. Besides being a Motor head, I'm also a Radio Geek; I've been playing with shortwave and CB radios since I was a kid. So to make sure the last car on my National Parks Tours can hear me, I did a lot of homework and started gathering parts to build a Killer Mobile Two-way for my plastic car.

First problem: The body (roof) material is Carbon Fiber on all C7's

coupes, and along with the new "Solar" glass used in the side and rear windows, it all tends to suppress the transmitting and receiving of RF (Radio Frequency) signal (ragtops do fair better because of the cloth top). So for maximum performance with a coupe, the antenna needs to be on the outside of the greenhouse.

Second Problem: Antennas do not work well without a ground plane. OK, what's a ground plane; think of the vertical antenna or whip as the emitter or positive part of the RF signal. To complete the circuit we need a negative surface such as a metal roof or rear deck lid to act as a reflective surface. Metal surface? On a Corvette? Not going to happen; so after several hours of research on the web, I decided to build my own ground plane using 25 feet of braided 1/2" copper ground strap laid in the gutter of the rear hatch (held in place with double stick tape). I grounded my homemade antenna mount to the ground plane (strap) plus I ran a leigh of ground strap down to the battery ground.....OK, Ground Plane completed!

Picking an Antenna: Choosing an antenna is like shopping for tires; are you looking for price, performance, mileage, etc. I went with a center load, 33" tunable <u>Larsen</u> NMO (mount) antenna; this gives me a good combination of reception and talk distance. As an alternate, the <u>Tram Model 1174</u> is my backup; it comes with either NMO or Magnetic mount. NOTE; when searching for an antenna you may run across "Marine Antenna's" stating they do not need a ground plane. Though this statement is somewhat correct, the marine type antennas have a ground plane built into the base, but are not as efficient as having

a metal reflective surface or radial arms sticking out horizontally at the base which is not very practical for our use.

Picking a Radio: If you have acquired one of the handhelds I spoke about in last month's article, either of the outside mounted antenna's listed above will give you awesome results in the way of much longer range and better reception. For my MiM Tours, I needed maximum efficiency while covering 30+ cars strung out behind me so I went for the larger mobile type radio. For the majority of you, the smaller, higher output handheld radios will be your first choice. They fit in cup holders, can be stuck on the dash or clipped on the sun visor. The larger mobile type radio takes a little more creativity to find mounting room in a small sports car.

I went the (Made in China) <u>Baofeng BF-9500</u>, a very compact two way that fits nicely between the seats at the rear of the center console. The downside I found is, it's next to impossible to program by hand, mainly because the manual is so poorly written (translated). To make life a lot easier, I spent a few more bucks (\$50) on the <u>RTSystems Programming Software</u>; and it has been worth every penny!

The last thing, matching the Antenna to the Radio: This is done with an SWR meter and by trimming the leigh of bottom section of the Larson antenna (or a little off the Tram Antenna mast) until the lowest SWR reading can be obtained.... piece of cake. To finish off the project, run the antenna coax around the perimeter of the cargo area under the carpet. NOTE: never EVER roll up excess coax cable neatly like a garden hose. Doing so will setup a magnetic field, mucking up your SWR match and power output. Just throw it loosely under the rear carpet and you'll be fine.

Road Test: On the NP Tour last year I had no problem hitting the last person some 30 cars back in line with a good, clear audio signal. At times there were 3 miles of hilly country road between us and that was on the low 10 watt power setting.





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

I'm sure that was quite a project given the altitude and weather. If I remember correctly my first trip over the road was in 1962 or 1963. It really hasn't changed much.






Does this look like fun or what? The passenger typically has the most fun on this stretch as the driver has to make sure to stay on the road and keep watch for tourists.








During the heat of the summer the elk are usually at high altitude, so we may see some. We will be topping out at over 12,000 feet.


The Steamboat Grand – This serves as the hub of activity for VOTR.

They are expecting quite a crowd. It looks like a good group in 2011. This should be a very large time.






LSCC End of Summer Trip 2018 – VETTES on the ROCKIES

After a couple of fun days at VOTR, we will turn our sights southwest and head for Montrose. Sunday will primarily be a day devoted to scenic driving over the Grand Mesa area of Colorado.





At present our one planned scenic stop on this leg is the Black Canyon of the Gunnison. The canyon is spectacular. My mom and sister saw a mountain lion from a range of about 40 yards on one of their stops here. We should arrive at an ideal time to view the canyon.



The following day, our first stop will be Ouray, named for Chief Ouray of the Ute tribe. The town is known for its hot mineral spring baths and natural beauty. Approximately one million ounces of gold were mined in the Ouray area in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Ouray is also known as the "Switzerland of America". There may be some marketing going on there, but the scenery is pretty spectacular.

D1MAW6 www.alamy.com A quick look and we are on our way. The "Million Dollar Highway" beckons. There are several stories with regard to how the highway got its name. Some say that it cost a million dollars a mile to build, others that the road bed, because it was built in part from mine tailings, contains a million dollars of gold and silver ore per mile. For us it will be the views that have the value, so enjoy the drive.

It's quite a sight, running down the "Million Dollar Highway" towards Silverton. Pay attention to this section of road, there are steep drops and, for the most part, no guardrails. Passengers have your cameras ready. This is a fairly tame section.

We are going to have a number of activities to choose from in the area between Silverton and Durango. Depending on what folks have done before or what they have an interest in on this trip we may end up somewhat scattered out. There are mine tours, train rides, an alpine slide at Purgatory, cliff dwellings at Mesa Verde, shopping, general sight seeing as well as other activities. In any case, we will be meeting at our hotel in Durango at the close of the day to compare notes and adventures.

Silverton's famous mines are no longer active, but the locals still mine gold and silver from the tourists.





Mine tours are still available. One of the favorites is the Old Hundred. That tour comes highly recommended.

Visit the mysterious secret underground world of the gold miner! Ride the electric mine train 1/3 mile deep into Galena Mountain then easy walking with your miner-guide through the quartz vein tunnels for live mining demonstrations. You'll see operating air drills, hoisting skip, slusher, mucker and learn about the "honey" wagon - all authentic San Juan mining equipment from the 1930's - 1960's. Do your own mining at the sluice boxes outside and keep what you find! Somehow we missed this tour on previous trips, but plan to make it this time.

The Durango and Silverton narrow gage train is a treat for the steam train aficionados. It winds its way down the Animas River valley to Durango. The best way to ride is to take the train to Durango and the ride bus for the return to Silverton. If you opt for this train ride, plan on it taking most of the day. Interestingly enough I couldn't find a picture of the bus.

"On our railroad, you will experience Colorado at its best...wildlife, waterfalls, majestic peaks, all from the view of an 1880s train. You will see places you can get to only by foot or train. You will experience first-hand why the D&SNGRR was voted "One of the World's Top Ten Most Exciting Train Rides" by the Society of American Travel Writers in 2009. The most important part of our mission is you. It is to give you an experience you will never forget. Riding the D&SNGRR you are now a part of history". We've ridden the train several times and it is a great experience.

The Purgatory ski area is the home of an alpine slide. It resembles a twin bobsled run using a plastic "sled" for the ride. Competition can get fierce. I'm not sure how fast you can go, but it seems fast.



Oops! Well, it's faster and more comfortable on the sled than it is on your rear end. Here is where to find additional information regarding the Alpine Slide - http://purgatory.com/alpine-slide/

Mesa Verde National Park (https://www.nps.gov/meve/index.htm) is located about 50 miles west of Durango. Mesa Verde, Spanish for green table, offers a spectacular look into the lives of the Ancestral Pueblo people who made it their home for over 700 years, from AD 600 to 1300. Today the park protects nearly 5,000 known archeological sites, including 600 cliff dwellings. These sites are some of the most notable and best preserved in the United States. By the time you get there and see the main attractions this is pretty much an all-day affair. It is extremely interesting.







The following day we head for Taos and Santa Fe. It's a more relaxing drive than the Million Dollar Highway, but still fun. We'll cross the Rio Grande in New Mexico. No wading across here.






Once across the bridge, we are on the home stretch to Taos. There is plenty of history and art in Taos. The city is home to Kit Carson's home and museum. It's worth taking a look.



There are also a ton of art galleries in town. If you are interested in Western Art, this is a good place to shop. Another interesting sight is the Taos Pueblo. Other than the glass windows and screen doors, not much has changed for hundreds of years. If you haven't visited here before, it is well worth the time. There is a lot of shopping here as well and no taxes. There are plenty of opportunities for early Christmas shopping.





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After our visit in Taos we are ready to continue the drive to Santa Fe. We will be taking the quick route from here. As we get closer to Santa Fe, on one side of the road is the Camel Rock monument.



On the other side is the Camel Rock Casino.

As you can see, the rock is much larger.



In any case, we will soon be in Santa Fe. Our accommodations are within an easy walk of the plaza where you will find great food and once again, shopping opportunities. I can attest that the jewelry stores do a great business. Also, be sure to stop at the La Fonda Hotel and the Indian market at the Palace of the Governors.

Around the plaza in Santa Fe. A great place to relax and watch the world go by.











There is new and old for sale here. We won't be leaving until after lunch so there will be time for wandering around the plaza and the downtown area. We won't be taking a lot of extra time on the way back to Amarillo. There are some remnants of old Route 66 in Tucumcari. Here is a sample.







From here it is I-40 for the rest of the way to Amarillo. Those who didn't have the chance to paint some Cadillacs will have another opportunity as we pass back by Cadillac Ranch.
