#### Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place!

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

#### **Good Friends... Great Cars!**

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

**Road Trips** – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

**Day Trips** – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

**Open Road Racing** – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just "click" on "Open Road Racing".

**Drag Racing** – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

**Autocross** – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

**NCRS** – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in the Dallas Autorama. On the first Saturday of each month, you'll find a bunch of us at Cars & Coffee in Plano, "kicking tires" and telling tall tales about our cars.

**Displays and Parades** – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

**Club Meetings** – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

#### **NCM News**

Last month we brought NCM merchandise to the LSCC club meeting. This is the fifth year we have done this and members' response set a record for purchases of over \$1,800! Way to go LSCC!

We were so busy with merchandise sales, I completely forgot to remind everyone about the Flint brick membership special. I will have these bricks at the December meeting for you to take home with you. Following is a repeat of the information from last month.

# Competitive

**Open Road Racing** starts on January 2nd with registration for the Big Bend Open Road Race. The 2019 dates for the race are April 24th-27th. If you have any questions, please talk with Mike Black, open road racing coordinator, and past winner of the event. Mike will stress the importance of registering early (1 minute after opening) as there are only a limited number of competitors.

The race takes place on US Highway 285 South from Fort Stockton to Sanderson and back (59 miles each way or 118 miles total). The road is closed by police for the race so sit back, buckle up, and get ready for the ride of a lifetime. There are different classes for the race, depending on the speed you want to average over the distance. Classes start at a relatively boring 85MPH and go all the way to unlimited. This event brings in hundreds of people to these West Texas communities from all over the U.S. and Europe.

The event starts off in Sanderson on Wednesday. Thursday has activities for the racers, including registration, technical inspection, rookie school, practice runs and qualifying. A welcome party is also held on Thursday evening. Friday's activities move to Fort Stockton for additional racer functions and a car show in Rooney Park. Everyone is invited to come out and see the cars and meet the drivers. On Saturday, the annual after the race party will be held at Rooney Park, which is where the racers end up after crossing the finish line. There will be music, food, drinks and lots and lots of fun.

This year's **Big Bend Open Road Race** has something for everyone so make plans now to be a part of this exciting event in West Texas.

High Performance Driving Education events continue through the winter season but you will need to register well in advance. The morning starts out with a driver's meeting. Drivers are assigned to different run groups, based on experience, with in-car instructors assigned accordingly. Each group has 4 or 5 on track run sessions throughout the day, with instructional classes in between the run sessions. All beginner drivers have an instructor seated beside them for live feedback, guidance, instruction and evaluation, to help guide in improving your performance driving skills. This is a great way to learn about your car and what it can do.

All other competitive events are done for the season and will return in the spring.



Each float/entry must signup individually and can have a MAXIMUM of two (2) components (cars, trucks, motorized apparatus, etc.). Groups with DIFFERENT troop/club numbers must submit separate entries. One entry form will not be allowed to represent multiple troops/clubs. Animal entries can have up to 20 animals on 1 entry, if more than 20 animals a 2nd entry will be required.

You can indicate below if there is another group you would like to walk with and we will do our best to accommodate these requests when ordering the parade.

You will be notified of your spot in the parade via email. Staging will be allowed to begin at 11:00 a.m. at your designated parade spot. You MUST be in your designated spot in the parade order no later than 1:00PM.

All motorized entries (trucks, trailers, motorcycles, cars) and all animal entries enter ONLY from Cedar at Exchange.

You may drop off parade participants at the High School parking lot near the tennis courts or at North Cedar just south of Exchange

In the event of a weather cancellation your registration fee will be NON-REFUNDABLE. Weather cancellation will be determined by the Allen Police Department and the Rotary Parade Committee on the day of the event.

Be creative & have fun! Certificates will be awarded to entries that take top honors in their category (see below) and a trophy will be awarded to the Grand Prize Winner. Winners will be announced the Monday after the parade and notified via email!

#### PARADE ROUTE

The parade will begin at Cedar & St. Mary, proceed southbound to Main Street; turn right on Main Street; turn right on Allen Drive and end at Allen Drive and St. Mary at the traffic circle.


#### **CANDY**

## Corvette Magnetic Ride Control Upgrade

As described in an announcement by Chevrolet Performance, Corvette development engineers have new tools which help them better analyze Magnetic Ride Control (MRC) data recorded on the bench, on the road, and on the track. These tools have resulted in major improvements in Tour, Sport, and Track modes for all MRC vehicles. The improvements are so significant that all 2019 MRC Corvettes will include the new calibration.

Chevrolet Performance is now making these new calibrations available to all customers already in possession of a 2014-2018 7<sup>th</sup> Generation Corvette with MRC. These upgrades greatly improve ride quality and handling feel, and have been rigorously validated and tested to ensure all chassis systems work together.

Each Tour, Sport, and Track calibration is independently tuned for its respective chassis. The new calibrations exhibit a much more refined balance of the heave, pitch, roll, wheel, handling, and temperature compensation algorithms. In Tour and Sport Modes the driver will feel major improvements in impact isolation and integration. Ride motion and balance are also greatly enhanced. Parking lot and low-speed (25 mph and less) ride motions are more compliant and less jarring. Sport mode also improves the handling precision and balance. Like Tour mode, Sport mode will exhibit the same impact and body motion improvements over the original Sport mode. In Track mode, the balance and response to driver inputs are more linear, and vehicle dynamics, based on throttle response, have been greatly improved. Drivers should notice more linear behavior near and at the limit of adhesion.

For 2015and 2016 Z06 customers who have the Z07 package, there is an option to update the Tour and Sport calibrations and keep the original Track calibration.

For 2018 vehicles, <u>some</u> of the final improvements for MRC upgrades were part of the 2018 production release. Thus, the improvements for 2018 vehicles are also very significant but not quite as dramatic as the 2014 to 2017 packages.

As the owner of a 2016 Stingray with MRC, I was more than a little curious about this upgrade, which is priced at \$350. So I contacted my service advisors at The Thompson Group at Classic Chevrolet and made an appointment to do the software re-flash. The upgrade was downloaded directly from Chevrolet Performance via a high-speed data link. It took less than an hour from the time the car was pulled into the service bay. I was able to drive the car back home with instructions to allow the vehicle to sit for 8 to 10 hours prior to "spirited driving". The need for this is in the service bulletin as – The MRC damper system has a built-in temperature offset correction as part of the calibration. Allowing the vehicle to sit will allow the damper temperature offset in the calibration to accurately reset. The vehicle is still functional prior to sitting for 8-10 hours; however, the temperature offset correction will be less accurate, resulting in a less optimized operation until the damper temperatures normalize.

I am happy to report that the recalibration does improve the ride and handling of our Stingray in Tour and Sport modes as described above. We rarely drive our Stingray on a track or on the street in Track mode, so please report your own results of that when you have your MRC update installed.





The meeting was adjourned at 12:25 PM.



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
