Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place!

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

Good Friends... Great Cars!

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just"click" on "Open Road Racing".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

As we have said before the Classic is the main fund raiser for our charities, as well as being a fun event that attracts people from all over the country. We are a large club with most of the membership in the DFW area and should be able to easily staff this annual event each year. Raffle Tickets

Really good news announced at the Bash was that raffle ticket sales for all of us not in Kentucky are back.

Some months ago the Museum was notified that the procedure used to sell raffle tickets outside Kentucky might not be legal. After several months of research and consultation with attorneys, a revised ticket sales system has been introduced.

Instead of actual raffle tickets, <u>Raffle Ticket Request Forms</u> will be made available in various ways. These forms must be filled out and <u>mailed</u> to the National Corvette Museum. The only form of payment for mailed requests is by credit card. Multiple tickets for multiple raffles can be ordered on one form.

The simplest way to obtain the ticket request forms is from the NCM website. Go to www.raffle.corvettemuseum.org, click on the "click to download form" and print the form.

I will have order forms available at club meetings. At various times, including the June meeting, I will be able to take cash, checks or credit cards with certain orders as I will be delivering them to the Museum.

These drawings will be held when many of us are at the Museum on the NCM Caravan/25th Anniversary.

2019 Corvette Model Year Data

More interesting information was revealed at the Bash. Corvette Chief Engineer Tadge Juechter along with Corvette Product Manager Harlan Charles and Exterior Designer Kirk Bennion led a seminar, sharing

how the current model year numbers are looking in addition to what's coming down the pipeline. This year's event highlighted data for the 2019 model year, through April 1.

Kicking off the data shared was a rundown of how many of each model were sold with the 1LT Stingray Coupe topping the list, followed by Grand Sport Coupe, then Z06 Coupe and ZR1 Coupe. A total of 27,868 Corvettes have been produced for the 2019 model year as of April 1.

The model year is longer than usual, with Stingray, Grand Sport and Z06 production starting on January 29, 2018 and ZR1 production starting March 5, 2018. Though GM will be auctioning off the final C7 on June 28 (a black 2019 Z06), as with past models the car will not have been produced in time to make an appearance at the auction. The final date of C7 production has not yet been announced.



Nevertheless, the NCRS judging team arrived and was able to complete the judging process for the Corvettes that were entered for Flight Judging. No cars were registered for the Concours program. The 3 Corvettes judged consisted of a 1963 Coupe and 2 1967 Convertibles.

LSCC member, Gary Hardy, was present with his 1967 Honduras Maroon convertible. This car maintains its original 350HP / 327 engine and 4 speed transmission. Gary was successful in achieving a Top Flight Award. The other 1967 convertible in Black with a 400HP /427 engine and 4 speed owned by John McLeod, Jr., from the DFW area, secured a Second Flight Award. The 1963 split window coupe in Daytona Blue, a 340HP / 327 engine and 4 speed transmission, owned by Chris Hampe from the Houston area , also captured a Top Flight Award.

Congratulations to all the entrants for their efforts required to attain these Flight Judging Awards.

The next event for the DFW area, and also for Texas, will be the Lone Star Regional in Frisco. This event will be held at the Embassy Suites Complex in Frisco, October 24 - 26, 2019.

Texas Motor Speedway has asked the Club to provide 35 Corvettes on **Friday, June 7th**, and 28 Corvettes on **Saturday, June 8th**, to take NASCAR and Indy Car drivers on a Parade Lap following their introductions. Cars will be limited to convertibles with their tops down and coupes with their tops stowed. (Fixed-roof cars are not eligible.)

Drivers will be riding on your deck lid (convertibles) or standing behind your passenger seat for a lap around the track. Each car will get 2 tickets to each race. You do not need to sign up for both races. At this time, it is not known if your passenger will be able to ride with you on the Parade Lap. TMS will provide secure parking for your car during the race(s) if you choose to attend.

You and your guest will watch the race(s) from the new **Turn One Terrace** under the Speedway Club. In addition to being a great vantage point to view the race(s), the Turn One Terrace gives you room to move around and allows access to the 4th Floor of The Speedway Club and its amenities.

Schedule:

On both days, drivers will meet at the **TMS Dirt Track Pits**. Please note that your car will be inspected by TMS and **CANNOT** be showing any signs of leaking oil or coolant.

Friday, June 7th – Arrive no later than 6:00 PM. A drivers' meeting will be held at 6:55 PM. At 7:10 PM. The Parade Lap cars will proceed to the Infield for the NASCAR Truck drivers' introductions at 7:30 PM. Following the Parade Lap, you will be directed to a secure parking area if you wish to attend the race.

Saturday, June 8th – Arrive no later than 3:00 PM. There will be a Car Show open to all Corvettes from 4:00 PM to 6:30 PM. Attendees will also receive two tickets to the race and watch the race from the Turn One Terrace. Our Parade Lap cars will be kept separate from those just attending the Car Show. All cars will head to the Infield at 3:30 PM. Our Parade Lap cars will proceed to TMS Pit Road. All others will be directed to the TMS Track for the Car Show. At 6:30 PM, all the Car Show cars will depart the track. A drivers' meeting will be held for the Parade Lap cars. Following the Parade Lap, you will be directed to a secure parking area if you wish to attend the race.

2019 NCM National Parks Tour



Oh ya, and there's a wonderful Corvette show to attend as well...located in a quaint shopping center.

Who knows we may win the Club participation award again but that'll take loads of y'all to sign up for this great trip as the Tulsa Corvette clubs typically come out in droves. Here is what I need you to do as a LSCC member. Go the LSCC web page and sign-in as a member, then go to the LSCC calendar and register there for this October event. You will see all the hotel information there; I will be emailing everyone later about further trip details. Come along for the ride

The rumored next generation Corvette, C8, is getting close to becoming a reality. It will feature a mid-engine design and will be revealed, according to Chevrolet, at a stand alone event on 7.18.19. These are renderings from Corvette Forum by Chazcron based on spy photos and from photos taken on April 11th at the reveal announcement in New York City. Base pricing is predicted to be only slightly higher than existing C7 Corvettes which is causing a 180+ day inventory of the current models while everyone waits to purchase a new C8. So, contact Robert Shellberg, Classic Cheverolet Club Liason, if you're interested in deals and oppertunities on a new 2019 Cheverolet Corvette. Lone Star Corvette Club operates under Bylaws established when the Club was formed in 1983, and last revised in 2017. Members were asked by the Board of Directors to approve three (3) amendments to the Bylaws, explained below.

Voting on the Bylaw amendments by secret ballot took place at the Membership Meeting on May 11, 2019, held at Texas Motor Speedway.

The amendments considered were:

Article VIII-Board of Directors, Section B.2, specifying when Officer elections are to be held. The LSCC BOD believes electing Officers earlier in the year, and allowing the newly-elected Officers more time to learn their job and mentor with the outgoing Officer before taking Office, will encourage more Member participation in the Club leadership.

PASSED

The proposed amendment to Section B.2 is: "Officers will be nominated in **July** and **August**, voted on in **September**, and installed into office in January (except the Classic Officer-elect), and will serve for one calendar year. Any office that is not decided by majority vote in a secret ballot will be decided by a majority vote of the voting membership that is present at the September business meeting."

<u>Article VIII, Section D.</u> would be amended to read "Nominations for officers will be made from the floor by the membership at the **July** and **August** business meetings, or in writing to an officer prior to the **August** business meeting."

PASSED

Article IV-Membership, Section C.3, related to purchase of a Lifetime Membership by Active Members. Currently, Active Members are given the opportunity to purchase a Lifetime Membership over 4 consecutive quarters. The BOD believes this creates an excessive record-keeping burden, given how rarely the option is used by Members.

The proposed amendment to Section D. would delete the sentence that prescribes the option to pay for a Lifetime Membership over 4 consecutive quarters.



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
