The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just click on <u>Open Road Racing</u>.

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

So, who is Elfi's Silver Pearl Sisterhood? It is a group of women with a shared passion for Corvette, who enjoy celebrating the Corvette experience, uniting with other Corvette enthusiasts, promoting the traditions of America's Sports Car, and collaborating to advance the mission of the National Corvette Museum. Members pool their financial gifts and allocate the funds to a project or program at the Museum to maximize the impact of their philanthropy. Each member of the group has a unique opportunity to be connected to other women who are enthusiastic about all things Corvette, and to learn about the Museum's priorities and initiatives in a group setting specifically geared toward women. Members have an equal voice on how the pooled funds are utilized annually. A member may be as involved as she wishes, from serving as an ambassador to simply making a financial gift.

Why the name, Elfi's Silver Pearl Sisterhood? Elfi Wolfe Duntov is considered the Godmother and First Lady of Corvette! She would often accompany Zora to car shows and special events, and everyone who met her was immediately impressed with her grace, enthusiasm, and knowledge of America's Sports Car. She attended the grand opening of the National Corvette Museum and plays a pivotal role in the

story of the Corvette. It is an honor to attach her name to this new society; to continue her legacy of philanthropy among like-minded women in the Corvette family.

In 1965, Corvette introduced a new and exciting color...Silver Pearl. It was sleek, elegant, and powerful...much like the women who love Corvette!

Pearls symbolize wisdom acquired through experience, as well as generosity, integrity, and loyalty. While pearls make the perfect complement to flashier gemstones, they also possess an elegance that can shine alone!

Elfi's Silver Pearl Sisterhood is a women-driven organization that will allow like-minded women to share their love of America's Sports Car while furthering the mission of the National Corvette Museum. Much like a pearl, each member of this society shines on her own, but together they complement each other beautifully and make an impactful statement.

Who can join? Any enthusiast, owner, member, or friend who wishes to connect to other female Corvette lovers and advance Museum priorities through philanthropic engagement and a collective voice may become a member.

How does it work? Each member commits to a gift of \$1,000 per year (paid by August 1, annually). All donations are deposited into a restricted fund. The full membership of the group will meet at the NCM Anniversary Celebration each year and will vote on distribution of the funds. Each member has one vote.

How are funds awarded? The full membership of Elfi's Silver Pearl Sisterhood votes on distribution of the funds. The amount of money available for distribution is dependent upon the number of members and can vary each year.

Conservation of 1979 Experimental Corvette Underway

Last month the one headline in the NCM News concerned the oldest surviving 1953 Corvette chassis. This month we have news about an experimental 1979.

Both of these projects are funded in part by the donations received from the LSCC Classic auctions. These donations have helped Derek Moore, Museum Curator, ramp up historically significant projects.



The 1979 Corvette has an experimental chassis that was utilized to develop the engineering changes coming in 1980 and 1981 to the third-generation of Corvette. This Corvette's chassis was modified by A.O. Smith to accept different body mount locations and to utilize the aluminum rear differential housing and carrier introduced in 1980, used to lighten the Corvette.

The interior of this Corvette is also unique with several experimental components, including a power driver's seat that became available in Corvettes in 1981, and an experimental center console gauge cluster.

After the Corvette's life as an engineering development car, it was shipped to Bowling Green, KY to test the recently installed assembly line at the new Corvette assembly plant. This Corvette was photographed as it was lowered to the ground at the end of the line, and was featured on the cover of the June 1981 issue of Corvette News. This car, along with others that had been sent down for early assembly line testing, was also used to teach prospective new hires from the Bowling Green area how to assemble a Corvette, should they gain employment at the assembly plant.

The 1979 Engineering Development Corvette was acquired by the Museum in 2018 and, although disassembled, remains in mostly original condition. The National Corvette Museum Preservation Department is performing conservation treatments to the vehicle to preserve its original finishes and will then reassemble the Corvette for exhibit here at the Museum. The treatments being performed include cleaning the vehicle, stabilizing corrosion issues, and applying coatings to the vehicle's surfaces to protect it from future degradation.

Visitors to the Museum are invited to watch our team preserve this unique Corvette and save this portion of Corvette history for future visitors to learn from.

While on the subject of increasing the Museum's efforts in the area of preservation of significant cars in Corvette's history, we have a real fan in the NCM's new President & CEO, Dr. Sean Preston.

He said, "I'm excited to look at the museum and the exhibits from an outsider's lens and partner with the team to create new and exciting exhibits. I also think it's important that we focus on preservation of the collection. We want to expand the membership base, welcome a new generation of Corvette enthusiasts and become one of the most attended and supported car museums in the world."

The next event for the DFW area, and also for Texas, will be the Lone Star Regional in Frisco. This event will be held at the Embassy Suites Complex in Frisco, October 24 - 26, 2019.

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.

Autocross is held at Brookhaven College and the next one will be July 20th. We use a parking lot at the college so speeds are obviously slower than other forms of racing, but the activity level per minute can be higher than even Formula One due to the large number of elements which are packed into each course. The requested donation is **\$15 per car**. Helmets are required and loaners are always available.

Drag Racing is on summer break for now. The Fall racing season will start up again in September. The tracks are only 1/8 or 1/4 mile long, about the same distance as when you merge onto a freeway. Annual point standings are partially based on participation, so everybody that comes out to participate helps. Don't worry if you've never done it before, there will be plenty of folks willing to help. Contact Martha Kaus if you have any questions.

Open Road Racers, the next race will be the Sandhills Open Road Challenge, which is a 55-mile rally style open road race through the scenic Nebraska Sandhills on August 7th – 10th. Contact Mike Black at OpenRoadRacing@LoneStarCorvetteClub.com for further information. This is not the only open road race that the group goes to during the year. Please check the web site for other events and times.

Rally, the club does not sponsor rallies at this time but I will let you know about the SCCA group that holds rallies. Their next rally will be the "DFW Map Rally" on Saturday, Aug. 24th. They offer the popular GTA (Games, Tours, Adventures) rally, often known as the "gimmick rally". Speed is not a factor in these events. The teams are given a set of route instructions which tell them where to go so that all teams follow the same path to the ending point of the rally. 

2020 Officer Elections this September

Bylaw changes passed this year will mean the 2020 Officer Elections will be held during September's LSCC business meeting. Nominations will be accepted starting in July and continuing into August. <u>Article VIII, Section D.</u> would be amended to read "Nominations for officers will be made from the floor by the membership at the **July** and **August** business meetings, or in writing to an officer prior to the **August** business meeting."


