Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place! The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them. Our Club slogan says it all:

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just"click" on "<u>Open Road Racing</u>".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Autocross</u>".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "<u>NCRS</u>".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out." I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. Presentations will be made at the February meeting from those organizations nominated for 2020 Rotating Charity, so I encourage you to attend and hear what they have to offer. The Rotating Charity will receive 20% of the auction proceeds and other donations received during the Lone Star Corvette Classic event in May. On average our selected charity has received around \$5,000.00. Voting will take place later in February and the winner will be announced at the March 7th Club meeting. The charity must be a viable 501(c)(3) organization.

2019 was a good year for LSCC as we had 153 new memberships for the year, besting 2018 by about 20. We are off to a strong start for this year as well. Congratulations to all who joined, and we hope to see you at many of the activities that are offered and as a regular at our monthly club meetings.

If you watched the Barrett-Jackson auction in Scottsdale last month, you saw the rights to the VIN 001 C8 Corvette sell for \$3,000,000! Thankfully, the C8's that follow will have a few less digits on their invoices.

That VIN 001 could be built by now, as the first buyers will take delivery on their C8's this month. If you are not one of those lucky enough to have a build number, you should be one of the following:

- You are on the list to order a C8 at Thompson Group
- You plan to get on the list
- [] You wish you could be on the list

Whichever one you are, you need to seriously consider two must-order options for your new C8.

R8C Museum Delivery

It is what it says and it is an experience you will treasure.

You arrive at the NCM with up to three guests and are welcomed with signs commemorating the event. You will take a special VIP conducted tour of the Museum, where you will see your Corvette on display.

A very knowledgeable member of the NCM delivery team provides a detailed orientation of the car followed by a delivery presentation. The team department will have done a pre-delivery inspection and even installed accessories not done at the assembly plant.

Photo Album

With plant tours unavailable, this option is a must do. This is an opportunity to document your Corvette's build process at the assembly plant with an Owner's Photo Album.

Even if you have not opted for the R8C program, you can order this 20 page photo album that captures the complete build of your Corvette. It also includes a letter from the GM Assembly Plant Manager and the NCM President.

Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.

Proposed Amendment is:

Article V – Dues

C. ASSESSMENT OF DUES Governed by LSCC Bylaws, Article V - Dues

1. Initial application shall be **\$70** for individual membership (1 person) or for a family membership (2 persons). Initial membership includes 1 decal, 1 name tag per member and a membership packet.

2. Renewal membership will be \$70 for either individual or family membership.






