Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place! The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them. Our Club slogan says it all:

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just"click" on "<u>Open Road Racing</u>".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Autocross</u>".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "<u>NCRS</u>".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out." I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. C8 Deliveries

Shipment of the 2020 Stingray officially started on March 4. The Thompson Group at Classic received their initial shipment of C8 Corvettes the following day, March 5. As more shipments arrive, you might be ale to check out one of the new Vettes before it is picked up by its happy new owner.

Museum deliveries began the second week of March. Their first batch of 12 cars was received on Thursday, March 5. Included in that group were the VIN 25 Corvette that was raffled at the Museum's 25th Anniversary Celebration last August, and one of seven Corvettes ordered for guests to drive on track at the NCM Motorsports Park. The hues of the cars included Torch Red, Arctic White and Sebring Orange. In the batch are cars for NCM Board Chair Glenn Johnson and his wife Andrea, NCM Ambassador Jeremy Welborn and his wife Gina, and many other past customers! Delivered VINs include 25, 29, 30, 42, 50, 66, 93, 148, 167, 239, 247 and 369.

Both Glenn and Andrea Johnson of Port Neches and Jeremy and Gina Welborn of Lawton, Oklahoma, are LSCC members. The Johnson Corvette was the first C8 delivered at the Museum. Both couples plan to bring their C8s to the Lone Star Classic. In fact, anyone attending the Southwest Oklahoma Corvette Club show March 20-22, had the opportunity to inspect Jeremy's Sebring Orange coupe up close.

With this new information, we are informing our members of this date change. We're already communicating directly with those who had already signed up for the trip originally scheduled in April.



The Museum will give special recognition to LSCC members for their generosity at a reception just prior to the Winners Circle banquet during the Bash Friday evening. Depart for Bowling Green, Tuesday, May 26th; stay overnight near Memphis. Arrive Bowling Green May 27th.

MUSEUM CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC AFTER WEDNESDAY, MARCH 18th R8C CORVETTE DELIVERIES TO CONTINUE

Per executive order of Kentucky Governor Beshear, the National Corvette Museum is closed to the public effective at 5pm Wednesday, March 18. This closure does NOT affect the R8C Museum Delivery program for new Corvette owners picking up their cars.

Our top priority is the health and safety of our visitors, volunteers, staff, their families and our community. While there have been no known cases of COVID-19 at the Museum or in our community, the decision is based on guidelines from the CDC and public health officials attempting to slow the spread of COVID-19. We will continue to monitor guidance from local, state and national officials and will announce a reopen date once it is known.

Museum hosted events in March, April and early May have been rescheduled or postponed.

Museum administration will continue to work behind the scenes, offering customer service and managing the many on-going programs and projects, including renovations to the Performance & Racing Gallery, Design & Engineering Gallery and new Entombed Corvette display. Additionally, the Museum will be launching a new educational series, posting live videos each weekday at 10am CT geared towards kids and families on our Facebook page and YouTube.

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.



LSCC BIG TRIP 2020

Black Hills Corvette Classic Yellowstone National Park Grand Teton National Park Glacier National Park

Next year will be the 49th year for the Black Hills Corvette Classic. The Sioux Falls Corvette Club typically expects about 400 Corvettes to attend. Assuming that next year's event is similar to this year's, there will be plenty to see and do at this all Corvette extravaganza including: a banquet, drag racing, autocross, a show and shine, multiple sight-seeing drives including "Breakfast with the Presidents", opportunities to ride the "1880 Train" and more.

Some samples of what you will have the opportunity to see in the Black Hills South Dakota area:

- The Badlands
- U Wall Drug
- Mount Rushmore
- Crazy Horse
- Devil's Tower
- Deadwood (Bill Hickok's last stand)

We will depart the Black Hills after the BHCC has concluded and head towards Yellowstone National Park. On the way we will visit the site of Custer's Last Stand (Little Bighorn battlefield). We will make our way to Yellowstone over the incredibly scenic beautiful Bear Tooth Highway and then spend almost 3 days in the greater Yellowstone/Grand Teton National Parks area. The grandeur and breadth of the experience at Yellowstone is almost impossible to describe. From Old Faithful, the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, Prismatic Spring to the varied abundance of wildlife it will be an adventure you won't forget. Be sure to get photos of your Corvette with the Tetons in the background. Be sure to visit Jenny Lake in Grand Teton National Park.

The next stage of the trip involves a run north to Glacier National Park. Along the way we will have an extended drive along Flat Head Lake and will plan to stay outside the western entrance to the park. The following day we will have a leisurely drive on the stunning Going to the Sun Road viewing lakes, glaciers, waterfalls and truly magnificent mountain vistas. Bears, mountain goats, and Big Horn Sheep populate the park. Hopefully they will want to see us as much as we want to see them. We are going to take our time, so there will be plenty of opportunities to enjoy short hikes and set up the perfect photo. If you enjoyed Trail Ridge Road, you are going to love this drive.

We will then turn south for the run to Texas. Never fear, there will be opportunities for more sight-seeing. Strap on your tourist smile and bring your camera, we are going to have some fun! More to follow in the coming months.

For those that may not have two weeks:

The full trip will take 14 days, however there will be natural opportunities to head back to the house should you only plan to make a portion of the trip. We will leave on a Wednesday and travel directly to Spearfish, SD where we will check-in Thursday afternoon and kick-off the festivities. The BHCC event is over Saturday night, which would allow Sunday, Monday and Tuesday to reach the DFW area and spend only 1 week on the road. A second opportunity to head back early would be after Yellowstone and before Glacier National Park.

Hotel Reservations:

As usual, blocks of hotel rooms will be made available wherever the vendors will allow.

There is a good chance that we will have to make our reservations early for the Yellowstone and Glacier National Park areas. More information coming soon.

Honoring The Fallen

Throughout history, there have been more officers killed in the line of duty in the State of Texas than in any other state or territory. In 2018 we lost eleven officers, these brave men and women show up every day to protect us, not because it's their job, but because it is a calling!

The TXFallen Tribute Event began in 2008 as a police bike race honoring the lives of Texas officers killed in the line of duty. Over the years it has grown into a community fund raising event benefitting the Texas Police Chiefs Association Foundation. Through this their Officer Death Benefit Fund provides monetary assistance within 24 hours to the families of officers working in Texas who die in the line of duty. In 2018 they were able to provide each family with a check for \$5000 to help with immediate financial needs.

The bike race and event takes place each fall at the shops of Highland Village in Highland Village Texas. The 2019 dates for the event have not been finalized. There are many opportunities for you to get involved, such as, sponsorships, donations, and participation in the event itself. Since 2008 we have raised over \$210,000 for the Fallen Officer Fund. Help us reach our goal of \$50,000 this year!

Ask the restaurant where you eat regularly for gift certificates. When you're at a yard sale, garage sale or craft fair, pick up inexpensive items that can be grouped into gift baskets. Framed Corvette posters bring in lots of \$\$\$; autographed items, and unusual car accessories with 'Vette themes are very popular.

Pretty easy, right? You can bring your items with you to the monthly Club meetings, or contact the Live or Silent Auction Coordinator for pickup. We need everything no later than the Club Meeting in May.






