Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, we offer just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. Past trips have taken us to the the Black Hills of South Dakoda and the National Corvette Museum's 25th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just "click" on "Open Road Racing".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "Drag Racing".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama. On the first Saturday of each month you'll find us at *Cars and Coffee* "kicking tires" at Corvette World in Carrolton, TX telling tales about our cars.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII, Korea and Viet Nam Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in North Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including Judged and Show 'N Shine car shows, a variety of automotive vendors and good food. 100% of the proceeds from the Classic's live and silent auctions go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third "rotating" charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members. Last year the Classic donated \$25,000 to those charities.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

2021 Bash Caravan

SAVE THE NEW DATES – April 20-23 and April 24-29. Last month I asked you to save the dates of April 19-21 for our caravan to the National Corvette Museum. Plans have changed. There are now two parts to his trip.

On April 20, we will begin the first part, a scenic caravan to the NCM, with two or three days at the Bash. On April 24, the second part of the caravan begins a journey with a stop planned at the Ark Encounter in Kentucky and a scenic cruise into North Carolina. In Charlotte we will tour Hendrick Motorsports and the amazing Hendrick Car Collection. These are only highlights. For more information, see the separate article in this newsletter.

2020 Corvette Final Production Stats

Last month the NCM published the final production numbers for the 2020 Corvette as released by GM.

After six years as the most popular color Arctic White was replaced as number one by Torch Red. 25% of 2020 cars are Torch Red, 15% Arctic White and 11% Black.

Not surprisingly, Black was the most popular interior color, installed in 43% of the cars, followed by Adrenaline Red at 25%.

Carbon Flash Badges were the most popular with 91.6% of the cars. The Z51 package was selected on 76%. 3LT was the most popular package with 46.4%. Front Lift was opted for on 58.4% of the cars while performance exhaust (NPP) is on 89.2%. The GT2 seats were the most popular pick with 61.6%. Painted Carbon Flash Open Spoke Wheels were the most popular with 41.7%, closely followed by the Bright Silver Open Spoke with 36.9%. The National Corvette Museum will have delivered 943 Corvettes for the 2020 model year.



Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.



With the news of the FDA approving the COVID vaccine, I am hopeful we will be able to experience the 2021 Michelin NCM Bash. The Bash is scheduled for **April 22 (Thurs) – 24 (Sat), 2021**. Now with the Bash acting as a catalyst, why not expand the "What to see and experience" a bit. Every trip I coordinate has a "Hop-in, Hop-out" option, meaning join in what you have time to do and take off when you like. Since we plan to minimize interstate highways and include as many scenic roads as we can, the route will be slower and take a few more days than our normal trips. The complete trip will start April 19th and we will be back to DFW metroplex April 29th.

Here is an outline of the trip:

April 19th **(Mon)** – Leave from Buc-ee's in Royse City and overnight at The Lodge at Mount Magazine in Arkansas.



The Lodge at Mount Magazine overlooks the Petit Jean River Valley and Blue Mountain Lake; this resort

mountain lodge offers guest rooms with breathtaking views of the valley below. Gracing the south bluff of Arkansas's highpoint, the Lodge at Mount Magazine is one of the finest Arkansas lodges and offers some of the most breathtaking scenery in The Natural State.

April 20th (Tue) - Leave for Cape Girardeau, MO.





This historic Old Town Cape is the heart of the original community and current home to a charming array of restaurants, boutiques and historic landmarks. Standing guard between the downtown area and the mighty Mississippi River is a protective floodwall that features magnificent murals chronicling the history of Cape Girardeau and its unique relationship with Ole Man River.

April 21st (Wed) – Arrive Bowling Green and check in to Hilton Garden Inn.

April 22nd (Thu) – Everyone is on their own to participate in the Michelin NCM Bash however they like. XP-987 Recognition reception for contributing LSCC donors that evening, which will be followed by the Winners Circle for eligible NCM donors.

When we get to the Bash in Bowling Green, we are hoping that plant tours will be an option and if that materializes, we'll try for a group tour.

Many of LSCC members jumped in to commit <u>more than</u> \$250,000 within a month to the NCM's purchase of the XP-987 GT, a one-of-a-kind special exhibit. By sponsoring this "Corvette", the Lone Star Corvette Club will always be recognized as the primary sponsor of the XP-987 GT permanent display at the National Corvette Museum and participating LSCC donors will be invited to a special reception mentioned above on Thursday; this reception was scheduled for the 2020 Bash which didn't occur.

NCM Experience – LSCC will have the opportunity to participate in the "NCM Xperience" which can be arranged through Johnny Downs. Your Corvette receives an exterior cleaning and is then displayed on the floor of the Museum delivery area, similar to the highly requested NCM delivery (R8C) Program; cost is \$500. You will be given a VIP plant tour, if available, and Museum tour as part of the program, and are also given a one-year individual membership to the Museum, commemorative plaque, silver decal recognizing participation in the program, and an individual photograph in front of the Museum - weather permitting. There is special merchandise that can be

purchased showcasing the "NCM Xperience" logo and you can purchase bricks in a special commemorative section.

An optional High Performance Driving Experience school, or HPDE, at the track is also in the plans during the Bash but we don't have any further details at this time.

April 28th (Wed) – Leave for Vicksburg, MS. We should have plenty of time to visit the Vicksburg National Military Park.





Vicksburg National Military Park preserves the site of the American Civil War Battle of Vicksburg, waged from March 29 to July 4, 1863. The park, located in Vicksburg, Mississippi (flanking the Mississippi River), also commemorates the greater Vicksburg Campaign which led up to the battle. Reconstructed forts and trenches evoke memories of the 47-day siege that ended in the surrender of the city. Victory here and at Port Hudson, farther south in Louisiana, gave the Union control of the Mississippi River.

The park includes 1,325 historic monuments and markers, 20 miles (32 km) of historic trenches and earthworks, a 16-mile (26 km) tour road, a 12.5-mile (20.1 km) walking trail, two antebellum homes, 144 emplaced cannons, the restored gunboat USS *Cairo* (sunk on December 12, 1862, on the Yazoo River), and the Grant's Canal site, where the Union Army attempted to build a canal to let their ships bypass Confederate artillery fire.

April 29th (Thu) - Leave for the DFW area.

We will experience Corvettes, NASCAR, country roads and, most importantly, get better acquainted with other LSCC members. Newest Radio for Club Road Trips

It has been a couple of years since I posted an article on Club Radios, and with all the club trips proposed for 2021, this is an excellent time to start thinking on up-dating, replacing or purchasing a two-way radio. I just bought the latest generation of very affordable handheld two-way radios from Baofeng (China) that will tune to the FRS (Family Radio Service) frequencies which our club channel 5.8 is within this group. The power has been pumped up a bit over the last generation; but better yet is the improved audio output. This handheld has the best audio of any radio that I own. It's super loud and very clear in comparison

to the earlier generations of any of the other brands of Talkabout/walkie talkies.



Here is the link I used to order mine; <u>"AliExpress"</u> and it took just under 3 weeks for it to arrive (which is fast compared to other radios I have ordered from China). Be sure to read all the warranty fine print too. The radio will need to be programed to the FRS channels. If you are OK with using <u>CHIRP</u>, you can do it yourself; but if not, I will be happy to program any club member's radio for you. I've written a file to install 126 FRS frequency's using my laptop, and I can also personalize your radio with your name or handle that will show up on-screen each time you turn on your radio.

I put together 4 radio packages (one Red, Silver, Black and Yellow) and each will include a USB charging <u>cable</u> along with the in box accessories that come with each radio. I will program each radio and should have them at January's Club meeting. The first 4 people who <u>contact me</u> and reserve a radio can have one for \$35.

If you drive a C7 or C8 Coupe, I recommend adding an external <u>Antenna</u> because of all the carbon fiber and solar glass used in the new cars. The carbon fiber really cuts down your RF signal. Kinda like trying to talk to someone a mile away from inside your house compared to standing in the driveway. By using a

small Magnetic Base Antenna on the outside of your car, you can greatly improve your range and incoming signal as well. I know, where the H#\$% am I going to stick a magnetic base to a plastic Corvette? It's easy, by using an Adhesive Metal Mount you can

just stick one to the outside of the rear glass and run the antenna cable into the greenhouse to the radio. Simple as that.



On the inside of the car, I like the using an adhesive <u>Magnetic Mount</u> to hold my handheld two-way or cell phone in place. Just add one of the <u>Adhesive Metal Mounts</u> to the back of the radio or phone and it will mount in a perfect position to hear the audio or be ready to grab it to use.

Hey LSCCers, Kristina and I love LSCC road trips and try to attend as many as possible. We think they offer one of the best ways to see the USA in our Corvette and meet and develop LSCC Corvette friendships. Another way is to attend Corvette shows that other Corvette clubs host, such as Lawton, Hot Springs, Boerne, Tri-City, Wichita Falls. What these out-of-town shows have to offer are great drives and overnight stays, allowing more one on one time together.

For those who do not know, Kristina and I recently purchased a 2017 Grand Sport in Michigan. During the drive back to DFW, I was pondering what is the best way to take care of the paint of our new purchase. There is paint protection and then there are car care products. What paint protection options are there? When we purchased our 2004 Corvette, the only effective option was a front bra, mirror and leading-edge hood protectors. For the most part, they looked cool and did a really good job protecting the paint area they covered. The downfalls were the difficulty of installation, over time the protector rubbing the against the paint and they only protect a small area of the car, or as Maxwell Smart use to say, "You missed it by that much". Then there is the chemical side. What and how do I select car wash, polish, wax, interior, exterior, tire & wheel, engine bay and exhaust tip cleaning products. As you can imagine, there are lots of choices.

During the return trip home, we decided we would have the car wrapped with a Paint Protection Film. Once the car was wrapped, the next question was how do we take care of this finish? To help me with this decision, I turned to one of LSCC's sponsors, Cameron Johnson, Founder/CEO of Drive Auto Appearance Center. They have a brick and mortar location located in Plano. Cam along with James Allen have been very patient with me as we went through all the options of car care. Basically, we DIY'ers have a few more options than were available when I was rubbing on our 2004.




Doug Fehan to Leave Corvette Racing
